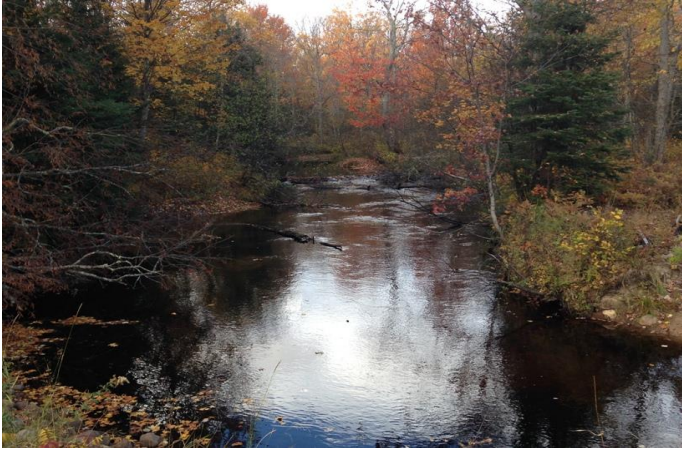


Sucker River Old Seney Road Bridge

Brook Trout

Species Description

Brook Trout are the most common trout that an angler will catch in the Sucker River at this location. Most Brook Trout will range from 7-10 inches with the occasional big fish around 15 inches.

Noteworthy

The Sucker River is wadeable, but not floatable. Private property is located downstream of the Old Seney Road Bridge so bank fishing is limited in this stretch as anglers should not exit the river along private property. Bank fishing is available upstream of the bridge. Most anglers will use worms and spinners for Brook Trout. September is probably the best month to fish the Sucker River. Deeper holes are located in both directions from the bridge, but are more abundant upstream.

Fishing Regulations

The Sucker River in the area of Old Seney Road Bridge is a designated Type 1 trout stream. Please refer to the Inland Trout and Salmon Stream Regulations in the current Michigan Fishing Guide.

Directions to Site

Leaving from Grand Marais, head east on H-58 for about 0.79 miles to Ellen Street (County Road 771) and make a right. Follow County Road 771 for about 4.25 miles to Old Seney Road (County Road 781) and make a right (south). Follow Old Seney Road for 2.5 miles to the bridge crossing at the Sucker River. Pull off along shoulder of road and park. Direct access to the river should be made using the county road easement at the bridge.
