Species Description

3,000 yearling Wild Rose brown trout are stocked into Guernsey Lake each year. No natural reproduction occurs, however, survival is good and multiple year classes are typically present in the lake.

Noteworthy

Guernsey Lake can be found just adjacent to the Sand Lakes Quiet Area. There is a Forest Resources Division rustic campground on the east side of the lake, with numerous hiking and equestrian trails nearby. The lake can be most easily fished with a small boat. The bottom can be soft in locations and wading can be tricky.

Fishing Regulations

Guernsey Lake is designated a Type C trout lake. Please refer to the Inland Trout and Salmon Lake Regulations in the current Michigan Fishing Guide.

Directions to Site

From the Traverse City area take Supply Road east to Broomhead. Take Broomhead north to the intersection of Guernsey Lake Road and stay to the right. Continue on Guernsey Lake Road approximately 2.5 miles. A signed two-track dirt road on the left leads back to the access site.
