Species Description

The brook trout population is self-sustaining with good natural reproduction throughout the system. Surveys have found fish upwards of 14 inches with average lengths above 10 inches.

Noteworthy

This river is mostly waded by anglers. Bank fishing is possible near the access site but private property and limited access makes bank fishing difficult. Floating is not possible due to many impassable log jams and areas with tight tag alders. Anglers that use natural bait have the most success.

Fishing Regulations

The East Branch of the Tahquamenon River in this location is a designated Type 1 trout stream. Please refer to the Inland Trout and Salmon Stream Regulations in the current Michigan Fishing Guide.

Directions to Site

Site is north of Eckerman Corners (intersection of M-28 and M-123). Drive north on M-123 towards Paradise for about 1.3 miles to the railroad grade heading east. The railroad grade goes directly to the river but it is a tight fit for many vehicles. From M-123 to the river is about 1 mile.
