Fish Species

Brook Trout; Steelhead

Species Description

Wild brook trout are present here in moderate numbers. Anglers report catches of larger brook trout in this stream reach. Surveys typically find fish ranging in size from 7 to 14 inches but larger fish have been reported by anglers upwards of 17 inches in length. A light run of steelhead exists here, adding the possibility of landing a large Lake Superior fish.

Noteworthy

This stream is very wadeable in this area. Log jams are very numerous and offer excellent cover for brook trout. Anglers may use spinners or natural bait this far down in the system. Floating is not recommended due to various log jams that make this river impassable.

Fishing Regulations

The Little Two Hearted River at County Road 412 is a designated type 1 trout stream. Please refer to the Inland Trout and Salmon Stream Regulations in the current Michigan Fishing Guide.

Directions to Site

This location is north of the village of Newberry. Drive north on M-123 for about 18 miles to County Road (CR) 500 and turn left. Follow CR 500 for about 11.5 miles to CR 412 and turn left (West). Follow CR 412 for about 2 miles and you will find a two-track pull off on the left side of the road.
