Fish Species

Brook Trout; Brown Trout; Steelhead

Species Description

The Carp River is stocked with both brown trout and steelhead, but natural reproduction of both species occurs. Brown trout and brook trout are most likely to be caught in this reach. In the fall, you might also catch some Chinook, coho or pink salmon.

Noteworthy

This location is known as "Rock Rapids". It has fast current over bedrock and boulders, with some plunge pools. At this location, there is a definite rapids/waterfalls. There are a number of other Carp River access points/turnouts along USFS 3755 (aka Townline Road) where the river is slower, more easily fished. Note that in all locations casting can be difficult due to overhanging tag alders.

Fishing Regulations

Directions to Site

From M123 north of Moran, take U.S. Forest Service 3332 (aka Nogi A Road) west to USFS 3458. Take U.S. Forest Service 3458 northwest to U.S. Forest Service 3755 (aka Townline Road). Take this main south. Where it forks, keep to the east - this road will end at the rock rapids location at the river. There are numerous turnouts off of USFS 3755 (Townline Rd) that go to the river.
