A plat and record of a survey of sec three (3) for M. Abson, D. Stafford, A. C. Stetson & others. We commenced at the South East corner of said section; thence S. 86° N. 10 chs to 6 lks to where a beech once stood mentioned in the field notes. To perpetuate the spot we placed a stone 16 inches long and about 9 wide, with "W" marked on the west side and "A" on the east. Abson's S.W. Cor. a long grayish boulder about 24 inches long and 6 by 5, with a horn resembling the one on an anvil. For A. C. Stetson's S.E. Cor. a boulder 18 inches long and concave on the N. side, and a "V" on the south, with a smallish limestone on the N. side. The other corners are designated on the plat by figures and described as follows:

- 1 A Post and boulder 18 inches in circumference and 10 long.
- 2 A Triangular limestone about 18 inches long & 12 wide in the middle.
- 3 Soft maple trees S 59° E 80 links.
Birch 12 inches in diameter N 66 E 90 links.
- 4 A post from which Beech 12 in. dia N 45° W 55 links.
Soft maple 4 in dia. S 47° E 70 links.
- 5 Post from which Beech 10 inches in diameter N 45 E 60 links.
Beech 6 " " " " S 49° E 30 "
- 6 Post from which maple 10 inches in dia trees S. 62° W. 10 lks.
" " " " " " N 42 E 29 "
- 7 Post from which Beech 8 inches dia. N 18° W. 43 links.
Horn. 20 " " " " S 80° E. W. 38 "
- 8 Post from which Beech 12 inches dia. S 72° E 6 1/2 links.
" " " " " " N 74 1/2 W. 39 "
- 9 Post from which B. Ash 6 inches dia. S 13° E. 21 l.
Birch 8 " " " " N 53 W 36 "
- 10 Post from which Beech 6 in. in Dia trees N. 15° E. 70 links.
" 6 " " " " " N 45° E 95 "

11 One Witness Stump standing from which I established the S.W. corner by driving a cedar post Aug 1879.

12 The hemlock 8 inches in diameter mentioned in the field notes was standing, from which I re-established the quarter post. No government post nor witness trees could be found. Re-established it as best we could by chaining and running lines. Drove stake but no witness trees near.

- 14 A stone 18 in long, concave on one side and convex on the other. Said stone has a V on the south side, with a whitish lime stone on the north side.
- 15 A large stone but no witness tree near.
- 16 S.E. corner one witness tree standing from which we re-established the corner by sinking a large stone, having a bulge on south side resembling an ox horn.

In passing the post line we commenced at the S.W. corner thence North 40° 35' N. 40 chains to quarter post. (See No. 12) Thence north on same bearing to the north boundary, 41.47 as represented by the plat. S. Edson, Co. Surveyor.
