BID INSTRUCTIONS (Ver. 06/23/2008):

1. Bid Location, Date, and Time: Bids must be received by the Unit Manager, Sault Ste. Marie Management Unit, Naubinway Field Office, PO Box 287, US 2, Naubinway, MI 49762, no later than 3:30 p.m. on April 20, 2010. For further information concerning this sale, contact the Unit Manager at 906-477-6048.
2. Bidder's Qualifications: Purchaser shall obtain workers compensation insurance to cover claims under Michigan's Worker's Disability Compensation Act of 1969 or similar employee benefit act of any other state applicable to an employee. If all or part of a timber sale was prepared by a private contractor, that contractor and that contractor's company are not permitted to bid on the timber sale contract. Bids will not be accepted from individuals or companies appearing on the DNR/FMFM No-Bid List. This list contains the names of purchasers who previously failed to execute a contract within 21-days or who have a history of poor performance.
3. Preparation of Sealed Bids: Bids shall be manually signed in ink; bid prices must be entered for each species and product in the Bid Price column for all material subject to bidding; and all fill-in blanks must be completed. If erasures or other changes appear on the forms, each erasure or change must be initialed by the person signing the bid.
4. Submission of Sealed Bids: Bid forms may be obtained from the Unit Manager. All bids must be submitted on the bid form and in an envelope clearly identified as described in this section. NOTE: Only one bid form per bid envelope. Sealed bids must be submitted to the Unit office designated in the prospectus and must be submitted at or prior to the time established in the prospectus. The envelope should show on the outside (a) that it is a "Bid for Timber," and (b) the sale name or number, and (c) the date and time of bid opening as shown in the prospectus. Bids received after the time specified in the sale prospectus are late bids and will be rejected.
5. Public Opening of Sealed Bids: If conditions permit, the sealed bids will be publicly opened and posted at the time and place set in the prospectus.
6. Award of Contract: Award of the contract will be made to the Bidder whose bid, conforming to the prospectus, is most advantageous to the State of Michigan on the basis of total value at rates bid for the estimated quantities. The State reserves the right to reject any bid or waive any minor irregularity in bids received. A written award mailed (or otherwise furnished) to the successful Bidder shall be deemed to result in a binding contract without further action by either party.
7. Down Payment: The Bidder to whom award is made must make a down payment within 21 days of the sale award. The amount of the down payment will be calculated as shown in the Bond and Payment Schedule of this prospectus. Only cash may be used to meet this requirement.
8. Performance Security: As guarantee of faithful performance, a cash bond, certificate of deposit, surety bond or irrevocable letter of credit (LOC) is required within 21 days of the sale award. The amount of the performance security is shown in the Bond and Payment Schedule of this prospectus. If an LOC or surety is used, the coverage must extend for at least 6 months beyond the contract expiration.
9. Timber Sale Contract: Additional conditions and requirements common to all timber sales are listed on the timber sale contract (R4031) and are available on line at [www.michigan.gov/dnr](http://www.michigan.gov/dnr). Contact the Unit Manager for additional information or a sample contract. Within 21 days of the date of the award letter, the bidder must sign the contract and provide the required down payment, performance security, and verification of worker's disability compensation. The down payment and performance security shall be in accordance with the provisions of the timber sale contract, in the sums stated in this prospectus. If these actions are not taken, then the Bidder, the Bidder's corporation, and the corporation's principals may not be permitted to bid on State timber sales for a period of 1 year. In addition, the Bidder certifies that if awarded this contract, the Bidder will complete the timber sale contract in accordance with its terms and any modifications thereof including requirements to purchase, cut, and remove the included timber by the termination date.

10. Disclaimer of Estimates and Bidder's Warranty of Inspection: Before submitting this bid, the Bidder is advised and cautioned to inspect the sale area, review the requirements of the sale contract, and take other steps as may be reasonably necessary to ascertain the location, estimated volumes, construction estimates, and operating costs of the proposed sale. Failure to do so will not relieve the Bidder from responsibility for completing the contract.

The Bidder warrants that this bid is submitted solely on the basis of the Bidder's examination and inspection of the quality and quantity of the timber offered for sale and the Bidder's opinion of the value thereof and the costs of recovery. No reliance should be placed on the State of Michigan's estimates of timber quality, quantity or costs of recovery. Bidder further acknowledges that the State of Michigan: (i) expressly disclaims any warranty of fitness of timber for any purpose; (ii) offers this timber as is without any warranty of quality (merchantability) or quantity and (iii) expressly disclaims any warranty as to the quantity or quality of timber sold.

11. Certification and Chain-of-Custody: Unless otherwise indicated in the contract under section 7 - Other Conditions of the Sale Specific Conditions & Requirements, the area encompassed by this timber sale is certified to the standards of the Forest Stewardship Council (FSC) - Certificate #SCS-FM/COC-090N and the Sustainable Forestry Initiative (SFI) - Certificate # NSF-SFIS-5Y031-S1. Forest products from this sale may be delivered to the mill as "FSC and / or SFI certified" as long as the contractor hauling the forest products is chain-of-custody (COC) certified or covered under a COC certificate from the destination mill. 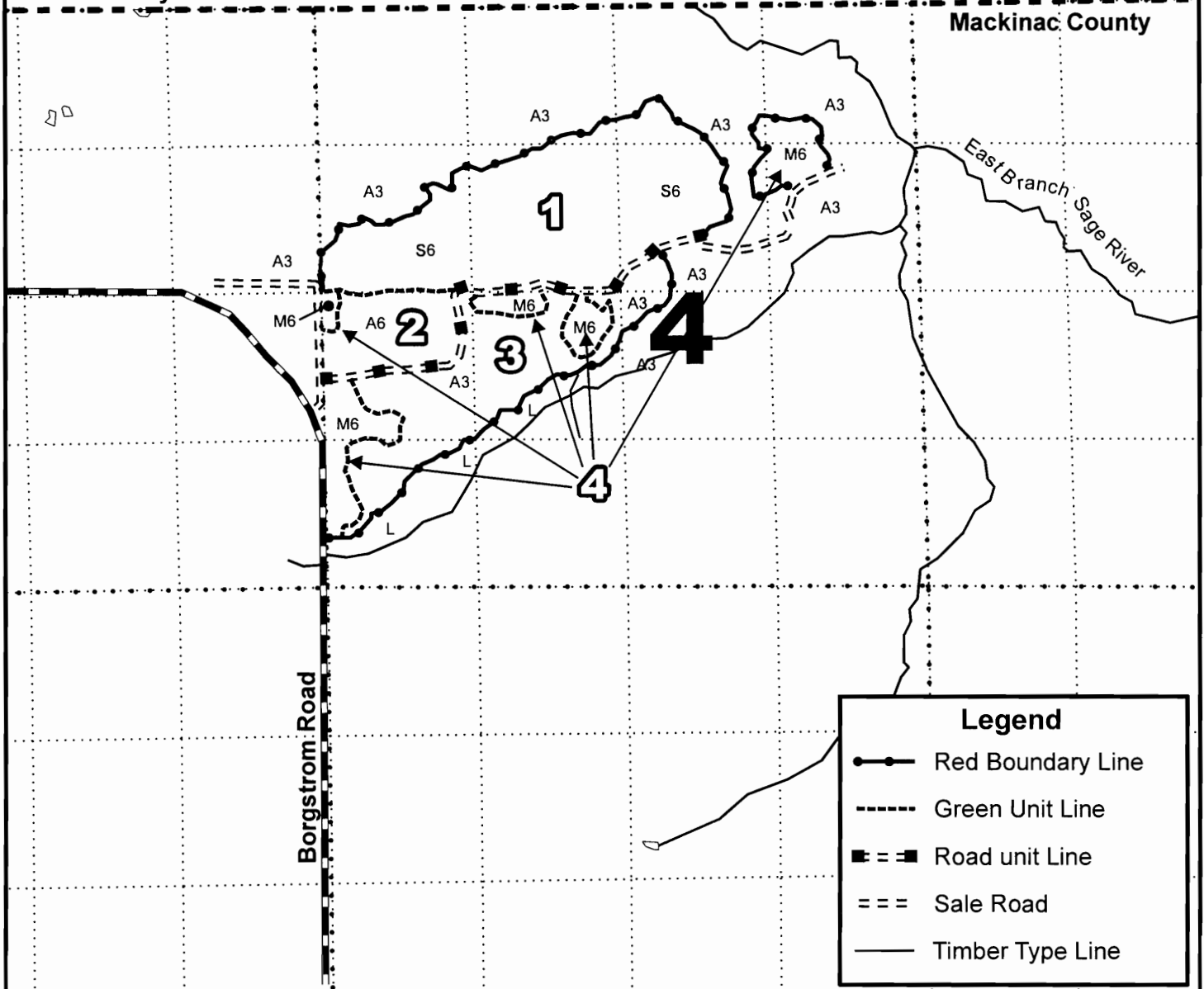

### 1 - Sale Area

#### 1.2 - Boundaries

##### 1.2.1 - Painted boundaries (6/05)

The sale boundary is marked and identified by red paint, Borgstrom Road and a gravel road. Payment units are bounded by green paint and roads within the sale.

### 2 - Timber Specifications

#### 2.1 - Included Timber

##### 2.1.1 - Clearcut unit(s) with unmerchantable trees (2/04)

Within Payment Unit(s) 1, 2 and 3, cut all deciduous trees that are two (2) inches or more in diameter measured at a point of four and one-half (4-1/2) feet above ground level regardless of merchantability. Also, in unit 1, cut all coniferous trees that four (4) inches or more in diameter at four and one half feet above ground level regardless of merchantability. In units 2 and 3 do not cut any spruce, balsam, hemlock or white pine.

##### 2.1.3 - Cut tree marked unit(s) (8/04)

Within Payment Unit(s) 4, trees are designated for cutting when marked with orange paint above and below stump height, regardless of merchantability.

##### 2.1.1.1 - Description of timber note (2/04)

Note that payment unit 3 contains no merchantable timber and is being sold on a per acre basis as miscellaneous pulp.

#### 2.2 - Utilization

##### 2.2.2 - Chipping (5/09)

Payment Unit 3 must be chip harvested. The purchaser has the option to produce sawlogs or pulpwood bolts, but the remaining portion of the trees must be chipped and hauled to meet future silvicultural criteria. In areas that are chipped, retain 15% of tops.

##### 2.2.4 - Skidding length (2/04)

Skidding of lengths over 17 feet is not permissible in unit 4, unless approved by the Unit Manager or their representative.

### 3 - Payments

#### 3.3 - Pre-measured Sales

3.3.4 - Dividing payment units (7/05)

Payment unit(s) 1, 2, and 3 may be divided at the request of the purchaser and upon approval of the Unit Manager. Dividing payment units is a contract modification which requires a Timber Sale Contract Supplement.

**4 - Transportation**

**4.1 - Construction**

4.1.7 - Road closure (4/07)

All new roads built into the sale must be blocked to vehicle traffic upon completion of the sale. In general, this will require constructing a four (4') foot high berm constructed of stumps and logs covered with earth. Contact the sale administrator for specific details of design and placement.

**5 - Operations**

**5.2 - Conduct of Operations**

**5.2.1 - Slash**

5.2.1.1 - Slash within sale area (2/04)

No trees are to be felled outside the sale area and all slash is to be kept at least 10 feet back from the red paint line.

**5.2.2 - Hazard Trees/Snags**

5.2.2.1 - Den trees (2/04)

Obvious hollow and/or den trees shall be protected and left standing unless they are a safety hazard.

**5.2.4 - Dead and Down Creation**

5.2.4.3 - Dead and down creation, dead trees (6/07)

Except as provided for in General Condition and Requirement 5.2.2, no dead trees, standing or down, are to be cut, skidded, or processed.

5.2.12 - Bark slippage restriction (3/07)

Within Payment Unit(s) 4, unless changed by written agreement, cutting and skidding are not permitted during the period of May 1st to June 30th. This restriction is because of bark slippage.

5.2.38 - No decking against live trees (2/04)

Cut products may not be decked against unmarked or designated leave trees.

**5.8 - Protection of Endangered Species**

5.8.5 - Protection of raptor nests (9/05)

All trees with raptor nests will be protected if found during harvesting operations. Notification will be made to the Unit Manager and Wildlife Biologist so an on-site evaluation and recommendation can be made, if necessary.

**7.3 - Contract Modifications**

**7.3.1 - Emerald Ash Borer**

7.3.1.2 - Emerald ash borer, ash or firewood on sale (2/05)

There is ash and/or "firewood" in this sale and it is located within an emerald ash borer quarantined area. 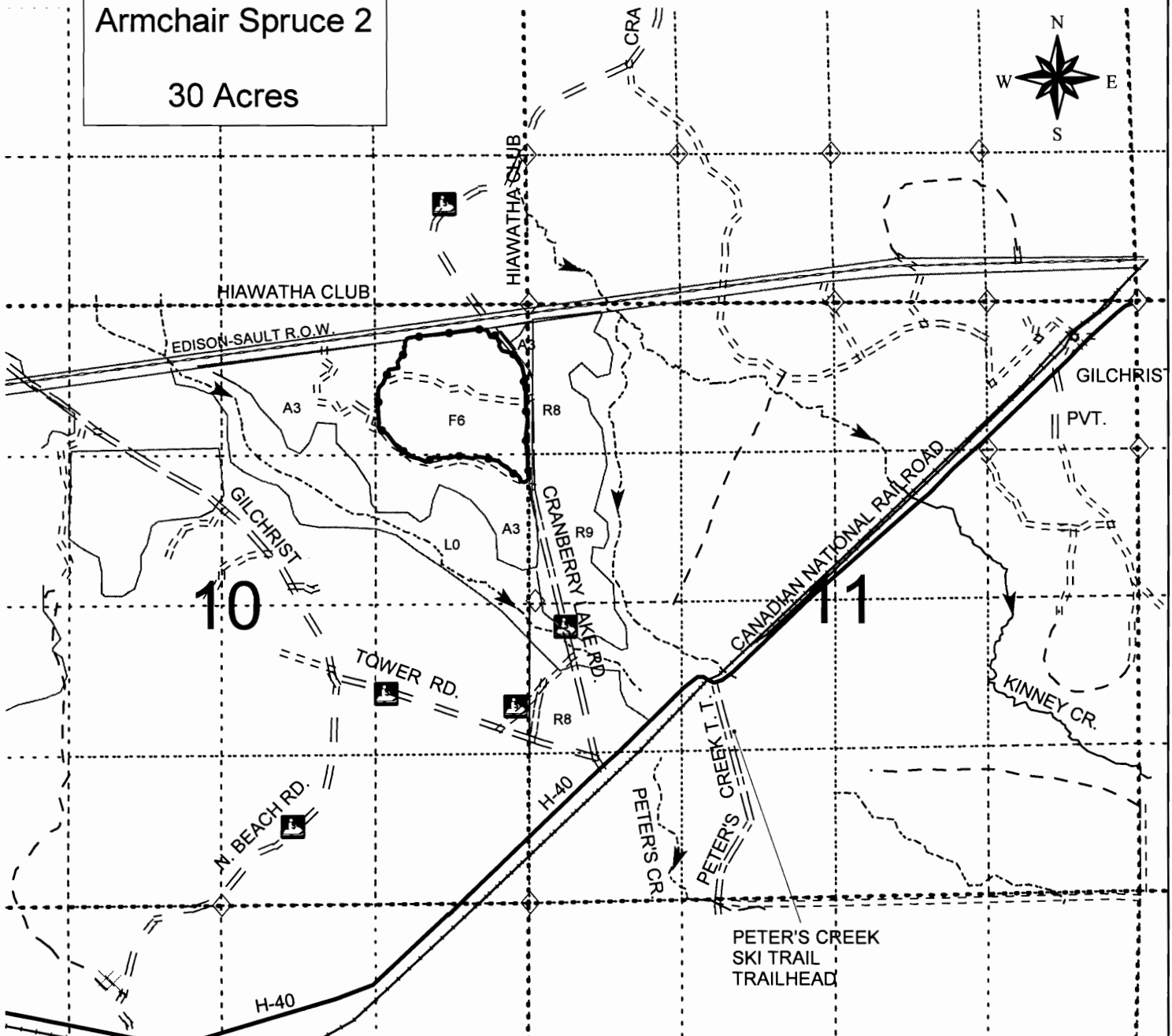

### 1 - Sale Area

#### 1.2 - Boundaries

##### 1.2.1 - Painted boundaries (12/08)

The sale boundary is marked and identified by red paint.

### 2 - Timber Specifications

#### 2.1 - Included Timber

##### 2.1.1 - Clearcut unit(s) with unmerchantable trees (4/09)

Within Payment Unit(s) 1, cut all trees that are two (2) inches or more in diameter measured at a point four and one-half (4-1/2) feet above ground level regardless of merchantability except white pine and red pine. Two (2) to five (5) submerchantable trees per acre must be dropped and retained on the site.

##### 2.1.1.1 - Description of timber note (2/04)

Note that the majority of mixed hardwood pulpwood is clumpy red maple.

#### 2.2 - Utilization

##### 2.2.2 - Chipping (12/08)

Payment Unit 1 must be chip harvested to facilitate future silvicultural activities. The purchaser has the option to produce sawlogs or pulpwood bolts, but the remaining portion of the trees must be chipped and hauled to meet silvicultural activities, except 15 to 30% of the tops harvested must remain on the site. The retained slash may be scattered or piled which may not exceed four (4) feet in height.

##### 2.2.3 - Stump heights (4/07)

Stump heights within Payment Unit 1 shall not exceed 12 inches for trees greater than 10 inches DBH and 6 inches for trees smaller than 10 inches DBH. This is in order to facilitate possible planting operations.

##### 2.2.8 - Utilization and removal (7/05)

All products meeting standards set forth in 2.2 Utilization must be removed from the sale area.

### 4 - Transportation

#### 4.1 - Construction

##### 4.1.7 - Road closure (4/07)

All new roads built into the sale must be blocked to vehicle traffic upon completion of the sale. In general, this will require the placement of berms, stumps, slash and brush along 30 feet of the new road system. These roads must be rendered impassable to cars and trucks. Contact the sale administrator for specific details of design and placement.

## **5 - Operations**

### **5.1 - Notification**

#### **5.1.1 - Pre-sale conference (12/08)**

A pre-sale conference on site between the Purchaser and sale administrator is required prior to beginning any operations to determine landing and road locations. The Unit Manager or his/her representative must be contacted at least 2 days in advance to schedule the conference.

#### **5.1.4 - Post-sale conference (2/04)**

A post-sale conference on site between the Purchaser and sale administrator is required 5 days prior to the completion of active logging operations to determine clean-up and repair of landings, road edges, and the fulfillment of other contract specifications.

#### **5.1.6 - Utility R.O.W. (10/08)**

It is the responsibility of the purchaser to obtain permission from the utility company to utilize the power line R.O.W. for operations.

### **5.2 - Conduct of Operations**

#### **5.2.3 - Operating Restrictions**

##### **5.2.3.1 - Operating restrictions (12/08)**

Within Payment Unit(s) 1, unless changed by written agreement, cutting, skidding, and hauling are not permitted during the period of December 15 to March 31. This restriction is because of the snowmobile trail and stump height restriction.

#### **5.2.4 - Dead and Down Creation**

##### **5.2.4.3 - Dead and down creation, dead trees (6/07)**

Except as provided for in General Condition and Requirement 5.2.2, no dead trees, standing or down, are to be cut, skidded, or processed.

##### **5.2.37 - No decking areas (12/08)**

No decking is allowed within 50 feet of Cranberry Lake Road without permission of the Unit Manager or his/her representative.

##### **5.2.41 - Snowmobile trail protection (1/09)**

The Cranberry Lake Road is a snowmobile trail and is shown on the Timber Sale Map. If the trail is used, it must be maintained and restored to a condition equal to or better than before the sale. Do not cut or damage posts with orange trail markers or traffic control signs. Maintain a 50 foot wide slash, debris, and rut free zone daily using the cleared right of way of the snowmobile trail as the east boundary. If the trail road is to be used for hauling during the snowmobile season, then a snow covered base must be left on the trail. All stumps within 20 feet of the snowmobile trail must be cut at ground level.

5.4.1 - Rutting restriction, general (1/09)

Operations are to cease immediately if equipment and weather conditions result in rutting of roads and skid trails 12 inches or greater in depth and 50 feet in length. The Unit Manager or his/her representative may restrict hauling and/or skidding if ruts exceed the specified depth. With the Unit Manager or his/her representative's approval, the Purchaser may return to the area when the risk of rutting has decreased.

5.8.5 - Protection of raptor nests (4/09)

All trees with raptor nests will be protected if found during harvesting operations. Notification will be made to the Unit Manager or his/her representative who will notify the Wildlife Biologist so an on-site evaluation and recommendation can be made, if necessary.

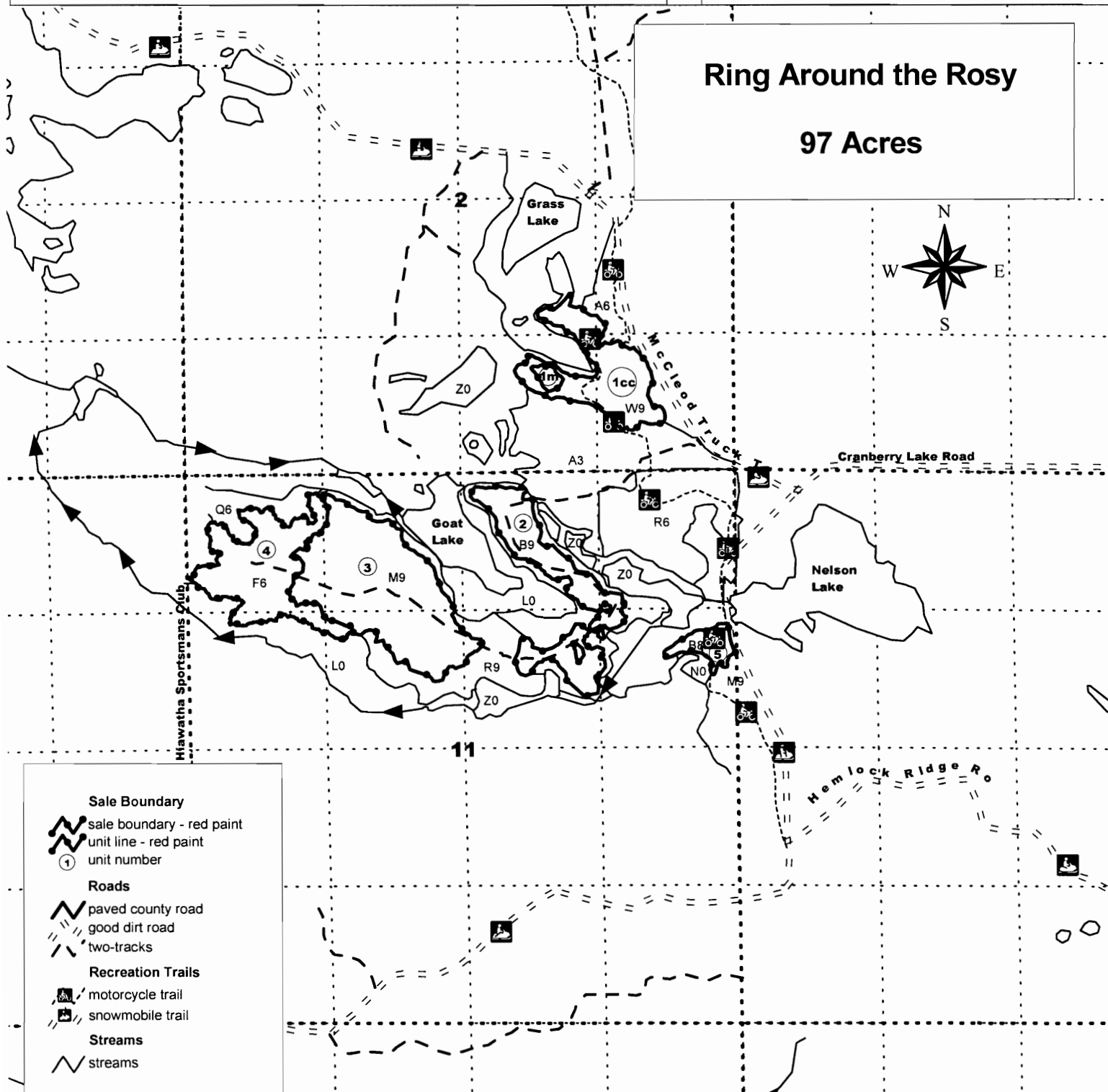

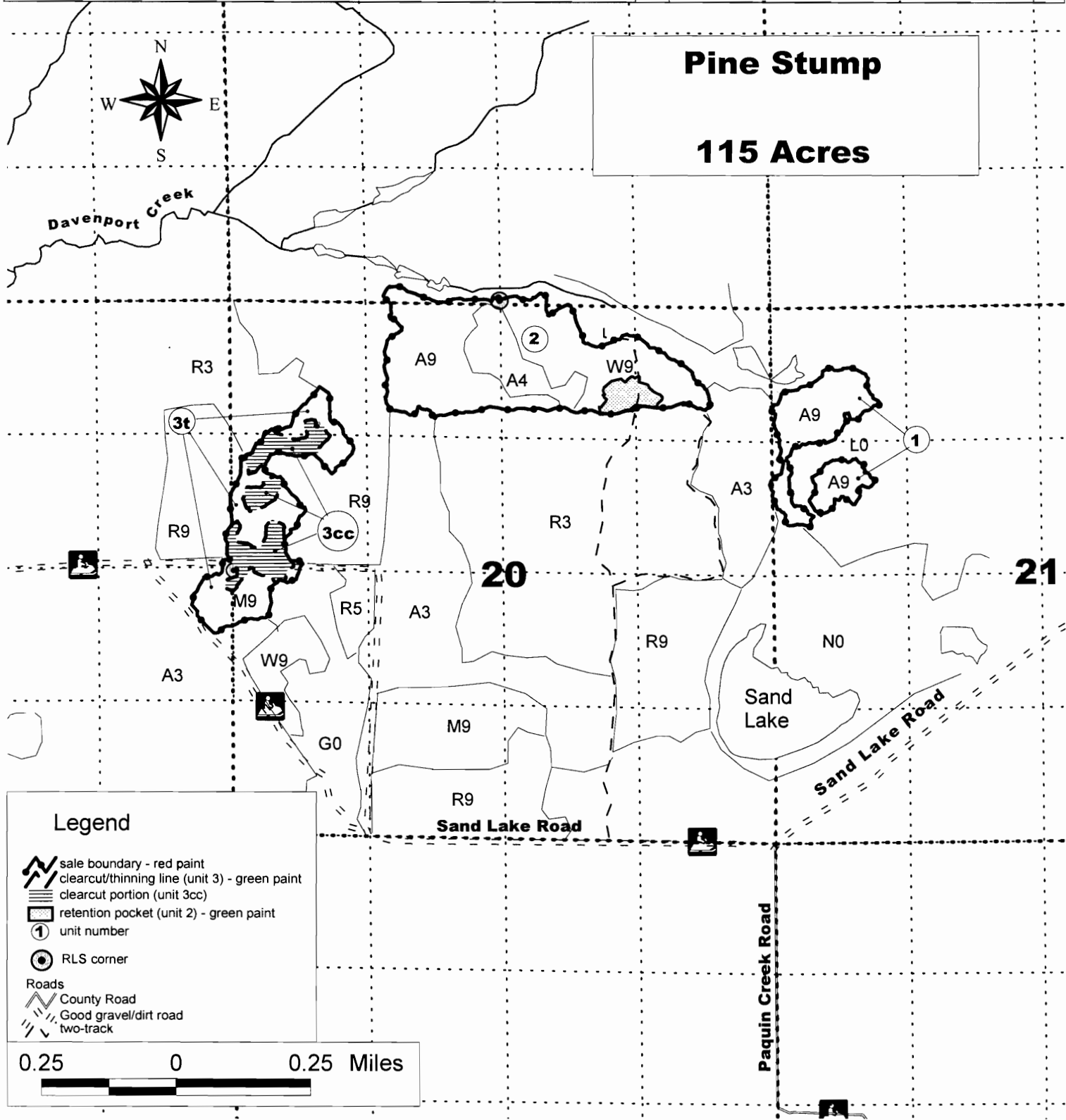
