NOTICE OF CHANGE IN GENERAL CONDITIONS AND REQUIREMENTS COMMON TO ALL STATE FOREST TIMBER SALE CONTRACTS

In May 2010, the Woody Biomass Harvesting Guidance was approved by the Chief of Forest Management Division. The purpose of the Woody Biomass Harvesting Guidance is to provide a broad context for harvesting woody biomass from forest land within a sustainable forest management framework, as well as specific technical recommendations. The Woody Biomass Harvesting Guidance will be applied to State Forest System management activities. It is recommended that this guidance be applied to all forest land in Michigan.

General Condition and Requirement 2.2 - Utilization, has been updated to implement The Woody Biomass Harvesting Guidance and the revised specification will be included with the contracts advertised with this prospectus. The wording has been changed so that unless otherwise specified in the contract, approximately 1/6 to 1/3 of tree tops and limbs less than four inches in diameter from designated trees not meeting utilized standards will be retained on site. The new specification is as follows with changes in **bold**:

2.2 - Utilization

Unless otherwise indicated in this contract, the DNRE product standards are based on utilization of a 100" piece to a top diameter inside bark of 8 inches for sawlogs in the northern Lower Peninsula, 10 inches for sawlogs in the Upper Peninsula and 4 inches for pulpwood. **Wood from designated trees not meeting these standards may be utilized, except retain approximately 1/6 to 1/3 of tree tops and limbs less than four inches in diameter, unless otherwise specified in this contract.**

If not otherwise specified, the maximum stump height shall not exceed 24 inches for sawlogs or 12 inches for pulpwood. Higher stumps resulting from multiple stemmed trees may be left if authorized by the Unit Manager or his/her representative. The Purchaser shall not cut stumps lower than the DNRE paint markings that indicate individual products to be cut. **Avoid removal of the forest litter layer, forest floor or below-ground biomass, including stumps and roots.**

BID INSTRUCTIONS (Ver. 01/20/2011):

1. Bid Location, Date, and Time: Bids must be received by the Unit Manager, Grayling Management Unit, 1955 N. I-75 BL, Grayling, MI 49738, no later than 3:00 P.M. on March 9, 2011. For further information concerning this sale, contact the Unit Manager at 989-348-6371.
2. Bidder's Qualifications: Purchaser shall obtain workers compensation insurance to cover claims under Michigan's Worker's Disability Compensation Act of 1969 or similar employee benefit act of any other state applicable to an employee. If all or part of a timber sale was prepared by a private contractor, that contractor and that contractor's company are not permitted to bid on the timber sale contract. Bids will not be accepted from individuals or companies appearing on the DNRE/FMD No-Bid List. This list contains the names of purchasers who previously failed to execute a contract within 21-days or who have a history of poor performance.
3. Preparation of Sealed Bids: Bids shall be manually signed in ink; bid prices must be entered for each species and product in the Bid Price column for all material subject to bidding; and all fill-in blanks must be completed. If erasures or other changes appear on the forms, each erasure or change must be initialed by the person signing the bid.
4. Submission of Sealed Bids: Bid forms may be obtained from the Unit Manager. All bids must be submitted on the bid form and in an envelope clearly identified as described in this section. NOTE: Only one bid form per bid envelope. Sealed bids must be submitted to the Unit office designated in the prospectus and must be submitted at or prior to the time established in the prospectus. The envelope should show on the outside (a) that it is a "Bid for Timber," and (b) the sale name or number, and (c) the date and time of bid opening as shown in the prospectus. Bids received after the time specified in the sale prospectus are late bids and will be rejected.
5. Public Opening of Sealed Bids: If conditions permit, the sealed bids will be publicly opened and posted at the time and place set in the prospectus.
6. Award of Contract: Award of the contract will be made to the Bidder whose bid, conforming to the prospectus, is most advantageous to the State of Michigan on the basis of total value at rates bid for the estimated quantities. The State reserves the right to reject any bid or waive any minor irregularity in bids received. A written award mailed (or otherwise furnished) to the successful Bidder shall be deemed to result in a binding contract without further action by either party.
7. Down Payment: The Bidder to whom award is made must make a down payment within 21 days of the sale award. The amount of the down payment will be calculated as shown in the Bond and Payment Schedule of this prospectus. Only cash may be used to meet this requirement.
8. Performance Security: As guarantee of faithful performance, a cash bond, certificate of deposit, surety bond or irrevocable letter of credit (LOC) is required within 21 days of the sale award. The amount of the performance security is shown in the Bond and Payment Schedule of this prospectus. If an LOC or surety is used, the coverage must extend for at least 6 months beyond the contract expiration.
9. Timber Sale Contract: Additional conditions and requirements common to all timber sales are listed on the timber sale contract (R4031) and are available on line at www.michigan.gov/dnr. Contact the Unit Manager for additional information or a sample contract. Within 21 days of the date of the award letter, the bidder must sign the contract and provide the required down payment, performance security, and verification of worker's disability compensation. The down payment and performance security shall be in accordance with the provisions of the timber sale contract, in the sums stated in this prospectus. If these actions are not taken, then the Bidder, the Bidder's corporation, and the corporation's principals may not be permitted to bid on State timber sales for a period of 1 year. In addition, the Bidder certifies that if awarded this contract, the Bidder will complete the timber sale contract in accordance with its terms and any modifications thereof including requirements to purchase, cut, and remove the included timber by the termination date.

10. Disclaimer of Estimates and Bidder's Warranty of Inspection: Before submitting this bid, the Bidder is advised and cautioned to inspect the sale area, review the requirements of the sale contract, and take other steps as may be reasonably necessary to ascertain the location, estimated volumes, construction estimates, and operating costs of the proposed sale. Failure to do so will not relieve the Bidder from responsibility for completing the contract.

The Bidder warrants that this bid is submitted solely on the basis of the Bidder's examination and inspection of the quality and quantity of the timber offered for sale and the Bidder's opinion of the value thereof and the costs of recovery. No reliance should be placed on the State of Michigan's estimates of timber quality, quantity or costs of recovery. Bidder further acknowledges that the State of Michigan: (i) expressly disclaims any warranty of fitness of timber for any purpose; (ii) offers this timber as is without any warranty of quality (merchantability) or quantity and (iii) expressly disclaims any warranty as to the quantity or quality of timber sold.

11. Certification and Chain-of-Custody: Unless otherwise indicated in the contract under section 7 - Other Conditions of the Sale Specific Conditions & Requirements, the area encompassed by this timber sale is certified to the standards of the Forest Stewardship Council (FSC) - Certificate #SCS-FM/COC-00090N and the Sustainable Forestry Initiative (SFI) - Certificate # NSF-SFIS-5Y031-S1. Forest products from this sale may be delivered to the mill as "FSC and / or SFI certified" as long as the contractor hauling the forest products is chain-of-custody (COC) certified or covered under a COC certificate from the destination mill. The purchaser is responsible for maintaining COC after leaving the sale area.

TIMBER SALE MAP

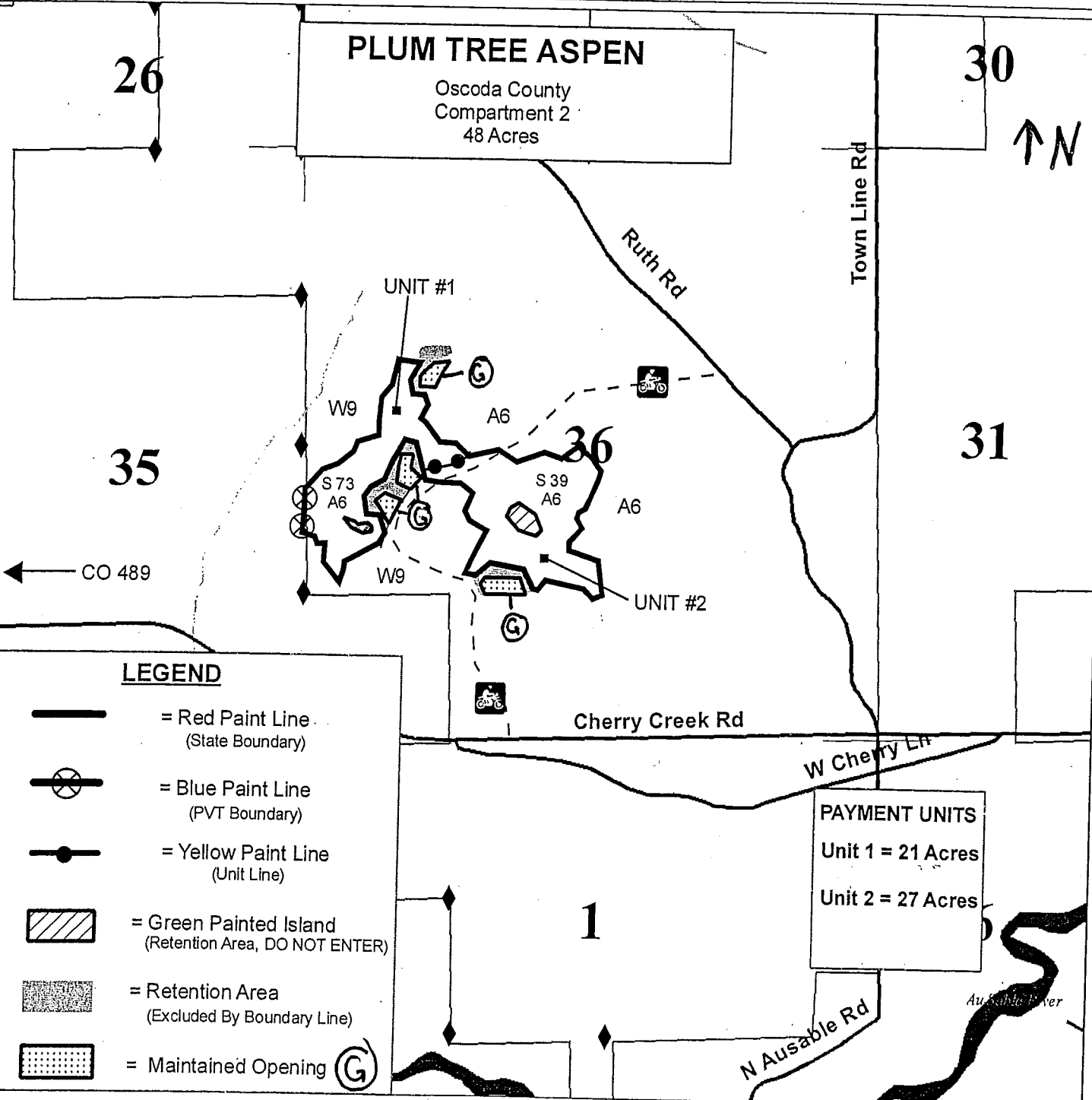

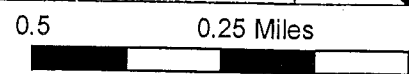
PLUM TREE ASPEN

1 - Sale Area

1.2 - Boundaries

1.2.1 - Painted boundaries (12/08)

The sale boundary is marked and identified by blue, red and yellow paint. Exterior sale boundary lines against private property are marked with blue paint. Exterior sale boundary lines against state are marked with red paint. Interior Payment Unit boundaries are marked with yellow paint. Do not cut painted exterior boundary line trees. Yellow painted trees designating an interior Payment Unit boundary are only to be cut when all surrounding Payment Units have been paid.

2 - Timber Specifications

2.1 - Included Timber

2.1.1 - Clearcut unit(s) with unmerchantable trees (4/09)

Within Payment Unit(s) 1 and 2, cut all trees that are two (2) inches or more in diameter measured at a point four and one-half (4-1/2) feet above ground level regardless of merchantability.

2.2 - Utilization

2.2.3 - Stump heights (4/07)

Stump heights within the Sale Area shall not exceed 12 inches for trees greater than 10 inches DBH and 4 inches for trees smaller than 10 inches DBH.

3 - Payments

3.3 - Pre-measured Sales

3.3.4 - Dividing payment units (12/08)

Payment unit(s) 1 and 2 may be divided at the request of the purchaser and upon approval of the Unit Manager. Dividing payment units is a contract modification which requires a Timber Sale Contract Supplement.

4 - Transportation

4.1 - Construction

4.1.3 - Slash and earthen piles (8/04)

Piles or windrows of earth along roads and landings that have been widened or constructed shall be leveled. Slash from road maintenance or construction, including stumps, shall be dispersed throughout the sale.

4.1.11 - Permits (5/07)

The Purchaser will secure any necessary highway permits that may be required.

4.1.12 - No new roads (6/10)

No new roads will be permitted in any Payment Unit. All operations are limited to existing roads.

5 - Operations

5.1 - Notification

5.1.4 - Post-sale conference (9/09)

A post-sale conference on site between the Purchaser and sale administrator is required 5 days prior to the completion of active logging operations to determine clean-up and repair of landings, road edges, and the fulfillment of other contract specifications.

5.2 - Conduct of Operations

5.2.1 - Slash

5.2.1.1 - Slash within sale area (2/04)

No trees are to be felled outside the sale area and all slash is to be kept at least 10 feet back from the blue paint line.

5.2.3 - Operating Restrictions

5.2.3.11 - Coppice regeneration protection (4/10)

To promote aspen regeneration, harvesting is limited to December 1st through March 31st.

5.2.4 - Dead and Down Creation

5.2.4.2 - Dead and down creation, hare and grouse (9/10)

To improve habitat for snowshoe hare, grouse, and other species, the Purchaser is to leave two trees, nine (9) inches or larger in diameter on the ground for every two acres. They should be scattered along the edges of the sale or positioned per the sale administrators instructions. If possible, the logs or trees should be felled so they overlap. Note these pieces should have a minimum length of five feet. They can be of any tree species and can be an un-merchantable piece of wood or a full tree.

5.2.29 - Shrub protection (9/07)

Do not cut or damage hawthorn, witch-hazel, dogwood, cherry, plum or juneberry. These woody-shrub plants are highly beneficial to various wildlife species.

5.2.39 - ORV trail/route protection (1/09)

The Michigan Cross Country Cycle Trail is an Cycle trail or route and is shown on the Timber Sale Map. Do not cut trees or damage posts with orange MCCCT markers. Maintain a 20 foot wide slash, debris, and rut free zone daily using the Michigan Cross Country Cycle trail or route as the centerline. Skidding across the trail or route may only occur in locations approved by the sale administrator.

5.2.43 - Opening protection (12/08)

No activities are permitted in openings marked on the timber sale map with the letter "G". Any damage to the openings shall be repaired according to specifications of the Unit Manager or his/her representative.

5.4 - Soil Protection

5.4.1 - Rutting restriction, general (1/09)

Operations are to cease immediately if equipment and weather conditions result in rutting of roads and skid trails which is 12 inches or greater in depth and 50 feet in length. The Unit Manager or his/her representative may restrict hauling and/or skidding if ruts exceed the specified depth. With the Unit Manager or his/her representative's approval, the Purchaser may return to the area when the risk of rutting has decreased.

6 - Safety and Fire Prevention

6.2 - Signing

6.2.1 - Road posting (9/09)

The purchaser is responsible for posting and maintaining caution signs on Cherry Creek Road prior to beginning operations. The road must be posted at appropriate distances from the sale area to warn of logging activity and truck traffic. Signs must be removed when harvest operations are suspended or completed.

6.2.3 - Recreational trail posting (2/10)

The Purchaser is responsible for posting and maintaining caution signs on Michigan Cross Country Cycle Trail prior to beginning operations. The trail must be posted at appropriate distances from the sale area to warn of logging activity and truck traffic at both ends of the trail. Signs must be removed when harvest operations are suspended or completed.

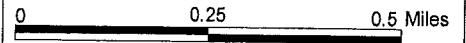

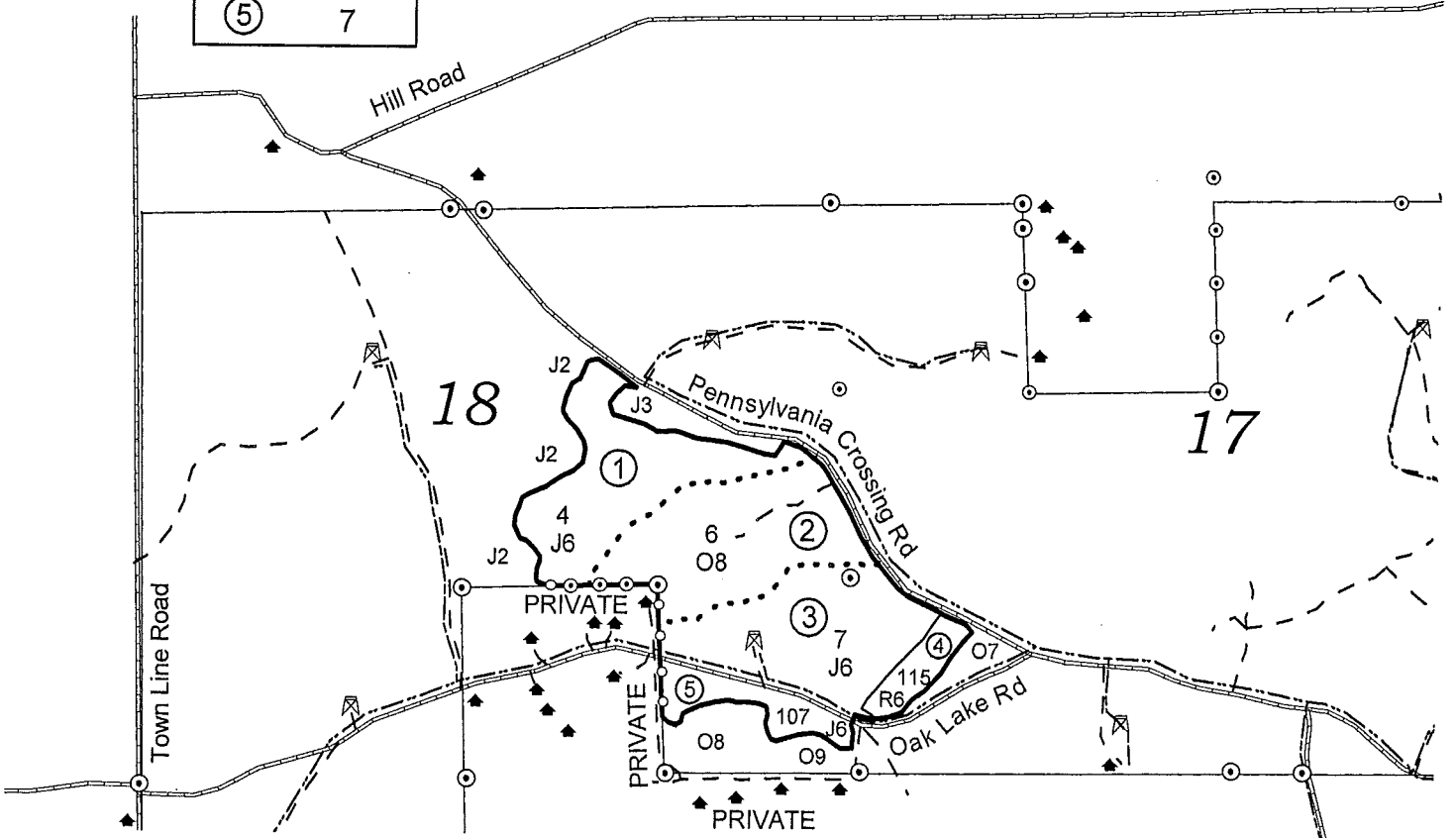

1 - Sale Area

1.2 - Boundaries

1.2.1 - Painted boundaries (12/08)

The sale boundary is marked and identified by red and blue paint. Exterior sale boundary lines against state are marked with red paint. Exterior sale boundary lines against private are marked with blue paint. Interior Payment Unit boundaries are marked with yellow paint, except for the unpainted designated boundary for Unit 4's red pine plantation, as shown on the timber sale map. Do not cut any trees with blue paint. Cut red-painted boundary line trees that meet the unit's applicable 2.1 Included Timber specification. Where the red-painted boundary borders the cleared corridor of Pennsylvania Crossing Road, cut to the road.

2 - Timber Specifications

2.1 - Included Timber

2.1.2 - Clearcut unit(s) w/o unmerchantable trees (12/08)

Within Payment Unit(s) 1, 2, 3 and 5, cut all jack pine and aspen trees which meet minimum piece specifications in 2.2 Utilization, except do not cut any stems marked with green paint. In addition, within Payment Unit 2, cut all mixed oak greater than 8 inches DBH, except do not cut any oak marked with green paint. Within Payment Units 1, 2, 3 and 5, all red pine, white pine, red maple, white oak, paper birch, cherry and balsam fir are to be left.

2.1.8 - Designated plantation row unit(s) (12/08)

Within Payment Unit(s) 4, all trees which meet minimum piece specifications in 2.2 Utilization, within designated plantation rows are designated for cutting. Designated plantation rows are identified by orange paint.

2.1.11 - Description of timber note (2/04)

Note that the overmature component of the aspen, jack pine and oak is disintegrating, with a high degree of cull due to die-back, breakage and interior rot. Note also that there are dense pockets of sapling regen that must be worked around, along with heavy slash accumulations from breakage, windthrow and fuelwood cutting.

2.1.15 - Hazard trees near county roads (4/05)

Cut and remove all standing dead trees within 100 feet of the cleared portion of designated county roads. These cut snags may be utilized.

2.2 - Utilization

2.2.3 - Stump heights (4/07)
