2. Bidder's Qualifications (1/11)

Purchaser shall obtain workers compensation insurance to cover claims under Michigan's Worker's Disability Compensation Act of 1969 or similar employee benefit act of any other state applicable to an employee. If all or part of a timber sale was prepared by a private contractor, that contractor and that contractor's company are not permitted to bid on the timber sale contract. Bids will not be accepted from individuals or companies appearing on the DNRE/FMD No-Bid List. This list contains the names of purchasers who previously failed to execute a contract within 21-days or who have a history of poor performance.

3. Preparation of Sealed Bids (1/11)

Bids shall be manually signed in ink; bid prices must be entered for each species and product in the Bid Price column for all material subject to bidding; and all fill-in blanks must be completed. If erasures or other changes appear on the forms, each erasure or change must be initialed by the person signing the bid.

4. Submission of Sealed Bids (1/11)

Bid forms may be obtained from the Unit Manager. All bids must be submitted on the bid form and in an envelope clearly identified as described in this section. NOTE: Only one bid form per bid envelope. Sealed bids must be submitted to the Unit office designated in the prospectus and must be submitted at or prior to the time established in the prospectus. The envelope should show on the outside (a) that it is a "Bid for Timber," and (b) the sale name or number, and (c) the date and time of bid opening as shown in the prospectus. Bids received after the time specified in the sale prospectus are late bids and will be rejected.

5. Public Opening of Sealed Bids (1/11)

If conditions permit, the sealed bids will be publicly opened and posted at the time and place set in the prospectus.

6. Award of Contract (1/11)

Award of the contract will be made to the Bidder whose bid, conforming to the prospectus, is most advantageous to the State of Michigan on the basis of total value at rates bid for the estimated quantities. The State reserves the right to reject any bid or waive any minor irregularity in bids received. A written award mailed (or otherwise furnished) to the successful Bidder shall be deemed to result in a binding contract without further action by either party.

7. Down Payment (1/11)

The Bidder to whom award is made must make a down payment within 21 days of the sale award. The amount of the down payment will be calculated as shown in the Bond and Payment Schedule of this prospectus. Only cash may be used to meet this requirement.

8. Performance Security (1/11)

As guarantee of faithful performance, a cash bond, certificate of deposit, surety bond or irrevocable letter of credit (LOC) is required within 21 days of the sale award. The amount of the performance security is shown in the Bond and Payment Schedule of this prospectus. If an LOC or surety is used, the coverage must extend for at least 6 months beyond the contract expiration.

9. Timber Sale Contract (1/11)

Additional conditions and requirements common to all timber sales are listed on the timber sale contract (R4031) and are available on line at www.michigan.gov/dnr. Contact the Unit Manager for additional information or a sample contract. Within 21 days of the date of the award letter, the bidder must sign the contract and provide the required down payment, performance security, and verification of worker's disability compensation. The down payment and performance security shall be in accordance with the provisions of the timber sale contract, in the sums stated in this prospectus. If these actions are not taken, then the Bidder, the Bidder's corporation, and the corporation's principals may not be permitted to bid on State timber sales for a period of 1 year. In addition, the Bidder certifies that if awarded this contract, the Bidder will complete the timber sale contract in accordance with its terms and any modifications thereof including requirements to purchase, cut, and remove

the included timber by the termination date.

10. Disclaimer of Estimates and Bidder's Warranty of Inspection (1/11)

Before submitting this bid, the Bidder is advised and cautioned to inspect the sale area, review the requirements of the sale contract, and take other steps as may be reasonably necessary to ascertain the location, estimated volumes, construction estimates, and operating costs of the proposed sale. Failure to do so will not relieve the Bidder from responsibility for completing the contract.

The Bidder warrants that this bid is submitted solely on the basis of the Bidder's examination and inspection of the quality and quantity of the timber offered for sale and the Bidder's opinion of the value thereof and the costs of recovery. No reliance should be placed on the State of Michigan's estimates of timber quality, quantity or costs of recovery. Bidder further acknowledges that the State of Michigan: (i) expressly disclaims any warranty of fitness of timber for any purpose; (ii) offers this timber as is without any warranty of quality (merchantability) or quantity and (iii) expressly disclaims any warranty as to the quantity or quality of timber sold.

11. Certification and Chain-of-Custody (1/11)

Unless otherwise indicated in the contract under section 7 – Other Conditions of the Sale Specific Conditions & Requirements, the area encompassed by this timber sale is certified to the standards of the Forest Stewardship Council (FSC) - Certificate #SCS-FM/COC-00090N and the Sustainable Forestry Initiative (SFI) - Certificate # NSF-SFIS-5Y031-S1. Forest products from this sale may be delivered to the mill as "FSC and / or SFI certified" as long as the contractor hauling the forest products is chain-of-custody (COC) certified or covered under a COC certificate from the destination mill. The purchaser is responsible for maintaining COC after leaving the sale area.

1 - Sale Area

1.2 - Boundaries

1.2.1 - Painted boundaries (12/08)

The sale boundary is marked and identified by red paint, along with an unpainted designated area. The unpainted designated portion of the sale is surrounded by state and bounded by Jackpine Plains Road to the north, the overhead powerline to the south, and the gas pipeline to the west, as shown on the timber sale map. Painted exterior sale boundary lines against state are marked with red paint. Cut all painted jack pine boundary line trees, regardless of merchantability.

2 - Timber Specifications

2.1 - Included Timber

2.1.1 - Clearcut unit(s) with unmerchantable trees (4/09)

Within Payment Unit(s) 1, cut all trees that are three (3) inches or more in diameter measured at a point four and one-half (4-1/2) feet above ground level regardless of merchantability, except do not cut any oak, red pine, or the survey corner witness trees ringed with blue paint.

In addition, within 100 feet of Jackpine Plains Road to the north, the two-track to the west, and the red line to the south and east, cut all snags and jack pine stems that are 4 feet tall and greater.

Also, within 50 feet on either side of the powerline, cut all snags and jack pine stems that are 4 feet tall and greater, except do not cut the blue-painted survey corner witness trees along it.

Also, the first row of planted jack pine along the west edge two track where the sale's painted boundary is located, is designated for cutting. This includes both marked boundary trees and the trees in between them.

2.1.11 - Description of timber note (2/04)

Note that the jack pine tends to be of poor quality (short & limby) and is characterized by low volumes scattered across a relatively large area.

Also, this sale was set up to facilitate restoration of the Shupac Prairie Ecological Reference Area (ERA). Because prescribed burning is part of the ERA restoration plan, the contract contains requirements to facilitate follow-up burning.

2.2 - Utilization

2.2.2 - Chipping required (9/09)

This area must be chip harvested to facilitate subsequent prescribed burn operations. The purchaser has the option to produce sawlogs or pulpwood bolts, but the remaining portion of the trees must be chipped and hauled.

2.2.3 - Stump heights (4/07)

Stump heights within the Sale Area shall not exceed 6 inches for all trees. This is in order to facilitate prescribed burn operations.

3 - Payments

3.3 - Pre-measured Sales

3.3.4 - Dividing payment units (12/08)

Payment unit(s) 1 may be divided at the request of the purchaser and upon approval of the Unit Manager. Dividing payment units is a contract modification which requires a Timber Sale Contract Supplement.

4 - Transportation

4.1 - Construction

4.1.3 - Slash and earthen piles (8/04)

Piles or windrows of earth along roads and landings that have been widened or constructed shall be leveled. Slash from road maintenance or construction, including stumps, shall be chipped or dispersed into the sale interior.

4.1.6 - Road construction (1/09)

Construction of new roads or improvements of existing roads shall be done in such a way as to minimize the environmental and visual impacts. Merchantable trees shall be cut and utilized unless otherwise directed. Non-merchantable trees shall be severed and laid flat on the ground. Slash shall be chipped, utilized or otherwise removed from the sale. Stumps shall be set upright, not left on edge, and be moved at least 10 feet away from the road edge. Disturbed soil shall be feathered into the woods and not left in berms or windrows.

4.1.11 - Permits (5/07)

The Purchaser will secure any necessary permits that may be required.

5 - Operations

5.1 - Notification

5.1.1 - Pre-sale conference (12/08)

A pre-sale conference on site between the Purchaser and sale administrator is required prior to beginning any operations to determine landing and road locations. The Unit Manager or his/her representative must be contacted at least 5 days in advance to schedule the conference.

5.1.3 - Well heads and natural gas pipelines (7/07)

The Purchaser is responsible for contacting the gas or pipeline company prior to operating equipment in the vicinity of well heads or natural gas pipelines.

5.1.4 - Post-sale conference (9/09)

A post-sale conference on site between the Purchaser and sale administrator is required 5 days prior to the completion of active logging operations to determine clean-up and repair of landings, road edges, and the fulfillment of other contract specifications.

5.2 - Conduct of Operations

5.2.1 - Slash

5.2.1.12 - Slash for prescribed burning (1/05)

To facilitate prescribed burning, slash shall be moved at least 100 feet from Jackpine Plains Rd, the west edge two-track, and the southern and eastern painted boundaries, and at least 50 feet from either side of the overhead power line.

5.2.3 - Operating Restrictions

5.2.3.1 - Operating restrictions (12/08)

Within Payment Unit(s) 1, unless changed by written agreement, cutting & skidding are only permitted when the ground is snow-covered and frozen, typically from December 31 to February 31. This restriction is needed to limit groundcover disturbance within the Ecological Reference Area.

5.2.29 - Shrub protection (9/07)

Do not cut or damage hawthorn, chokecherry or juneberry. These woody-shrub plants are highly beneficial to various wildlife species.

5.2.31 - Landing locations (10/09)

Landings locations are limited to the outer perimeter of the sale area. New roads within the sale area or the adjacent grassy openings will not be allowed.

5.4 - Soil Protection

5.4.1 - Rutting restriction, general (1/09)

Operations are to cease immediately if equipment and weather conditions result in rutting of roads which is 12 inches or

greater in depth and 50 feet in length. In addition, operations are to cease immediately if equipment and weather conditions result in rutting on skid trails which is 6 inches or greater in depth and 50 feet in length. The Unit Manager or his/her representative may restrict hauling and/or skidding if ruts exceed the specified depth. With the Unit Manager or his/her representative's approval, the Purchaser may return to the area when the risk of rutting has decreased.




Shupac Prairie ERA

1 - Sale Area

1.2 - Boundaries

1.2.1 - Painted boundaries (12/08)

The sale boundary and Payment Unit boundaries are marked and identified by blue, red, yellow and green paint. Exterior sale boundary lines against private property are marked with blue paint. Exterior sale boundary lines against state are marked with red paint. Interior Payment Unit boundaries are marked with yellow paint. Interior retention islands are marked with green paint and are shown on the timber sale map. These islands are not Included Timber and are to be left. Do not cut blue-painted boundary line trees. Cut all red-painted stems that meet the applicable Included Timber specification, regardless of merchantability, unless they are also marked with green paint.

2 - Timber Specifications

2.1 - Included Timber

2.1.1 - Clearcut unit(s) with unmerchantable trees (4/09)

Within Payment Unit(s) 2 & 3, cut all trees that are three (3) inches or more in diameter measured at a point four and one-half (4-1/2) feet above ground level regardless of merchantability except red pine, white pine, oak & cedar.

In addition, in Payment Unit 2, cut all snags and jack pine stems that are 4 feet and taller within 100 feet of the Payment Unit's boundary. Also, where Unit 2's west edge parallels CR612 cut the outer row of planted jack pine. This includes the red painted boundary trees and the trees in between them, except those marked with green paint.

2.1.2 - Clearcut unit(s) w/o unmerchantable trees (12/08)

Within Payment Unit(s) 1, cut all jack pine & aspen trees which meet minimum piece specifications in 2.2 Utilization except trees marked with green paint. All red pine, white pine and oak will be left.

2.1.11 - Description of timber note (2/04)

Note that this harvest boundary encompasses mature, immature, fully-stocked and sparse jack pine cover, interspersed with numerous grassy openings.

Also, this sale was set up to facilitate restoration of the Shupac Barrens Ecological Reference Area (ERA). Because prescribed burning is part of the ERA restoration plan, the contract contains requirements to facilitate follow-up burning.

Note also that 5 cord of black spruce pulp was added to the jack pine pulp.

2.2 - Utilization

2.2.2 - Chipping required (9/09)

The sale must be chip harvested to facilitate subsequent prescribed burn operations. The purchaser has the option to produce sawlogs or pulpwood bolts, but the remaining portion of the trees must be chipped and hauled.

2.2.3 - Stump heights (4/07)

Stump heights within the Sale Area shall not exceed 6 inches for all trees. This is in order to facilitate prescribed burn operations.

3 - Payments

3.3 - Pre-measured Sales

3.3.4 - Dividing payment units (12/08)

Payment unit(s) 2 may be divided at the request of the purchaser and upon approval of the Unit Manager. Dividing payment units is a contract modification which requires a Timber Sale Contract Supplement.

4 - Transportation

4.1 - Construction

4.1.6 - Road construction (1/09)

Construction of landings, new roads or improvements of existing roads shall be done in such a way as to minimize the environmental and visual impacts. Merchantable trees shall be cut and utilized unless otherwise directed. Non-merchantable trees shall be severed and laid flat on the ground. Slash shall be chipped, utilized or otherwise removed from the sale. Stumps shall be set upright, not left on edge, and be moved at least 10 feet away from the road edge. Disturbed soil shall be feathered into the woods and not left in berms or windrows.

4.1.7 - Road closure (4/07)

All new roads built into the sale must be blocked to vehicle traffic upon completion of the sale. Overgrown roads that are reopened shall be considered new roads. In general, this will require constructing a four-foot high berm of stumps and logs covered with earth. Contact the sale administrator for specific details of design and placement.

4.1.11 - Permits (5/07)

The Purchaser will secure any necessary permits that may be required.

5 - Operations

5.1 - Notification

5.1.1 - Pre-sale conference (12/08)

A pre-sale conference on site between the Purchaser and sale administrator is required prior to beginning any operations to determine landing and road locations. The Unit Manager or his/her representative must be contacted at least 5 days in advance to schedule the conference.

5.1.4 - Post-sale conference (9/09)

A post-sale conference on site between the Purchaser and sale administrator is required 5 days prior to the completion of active logging operations to determine clean-up and repair of landings, road edges, and the fulfillment of other contract specifications.

5.2 - Conduct of Operations

5.2.1 - Slash

5.2.1.12 - Slash for prescribed burning (1/05)

To facilitate prescribed burning, slash shall be moved at least 100 feet from the Unit 2 boundary. Do not leave slash accumulations within 50 feet of Unit 2's retention islands and do not leave slash piles near residual red pine or oak.

5.2.3 - Operating Restrictions

5.2.3.1 - Operating restrictions (12/08)

Within Payment Unit(s) 1 & 2, unless changed by written agreement, cutting & skidding are only permitted when the ground is snow-covered and frozen, typically from December 31 to February 31. This restriction is needed to limit groundcover disturbance within the Ecological Reference Area.

5.2.4 - Dead and Down Creation

5.2.4.6 - Dead and down creation, other (9/09)

To improve habitat for hare & grouse along the east edge of Unit 3, cut or push over red-painted balsam fir & spruce line trees, dropping them at an angle into the swamp, preferably so that they overlap. Specifics to be discussed at the pre-sale conference.

5.2.22 - Operating Caution

5.2.22.1 - Operating caution (12/04)

It is recommended, but not required, that within Payment Unit(s) 3, cutting & skidding occur during dry summer or frozen winter conditions. This restriction is recommended because the Unit contains pockets of low ground and its east

boundary was run to include the swamp edge in order to improve wildlife habitat.

5.2.29 - Shrub protection (9/07)

Do not cut or damage hawthorn, chokecherry or juneberry. These woody-shrub plants are highly beneficial to various wildlife species.

5.2.31 - Landing locations (10/09)

In order to minimize landing & road construction in the ERA restoration area, longer skids may be required.

5.2.41 - Snowmobile trail protection (8/09)

The snowmobile trail runs through Units 2 & 3 and is shown on the Timber Sale Map. Do not cut or damage posts with orange trail markers or traffic control signs. If the trail is used, it must be maintained and restored to a condition equal to or better than before the sale. If the trail is used for hauling, it must be graded to the satisfaction of the Unit Manager or his/her representative prior to December 1st. If the trail is used for hauling during the snowmobile season, then a snow-covered base must be left on the trail. Maintain a 20 foot wide slash, debris, and rut free zone daily using the snowmobile trail as the centerline. All stumps within 20 feet of the snowmobile trail must be cut at ground level. In addition, any trees cut within 5 feet of the trail must have the stumps removed and disposed of according to the direction of the Unit Manager or his/her representative.

5.4 - Soil Protection

5.4.1 - Rutting restriction, general (1/09)

Operations are to cease immediately if equipment and weather conditions result in rutting of roads which is 12 inches or greater in depth and 50 feet in length. Payment Units shall be cut in numerical order unless approved by the Unit Manager or his/her representative. Stand 4's aspen is breaking up the fastest and should be harvested first.

4 - Transportation

4.1 - Construction

4.1.3 - Slash and earthen piles (8/04)

Piles or windrows of earth along roads and landings that have been widened or constructed shall be leveled. Slash from road maintenance or construction, including stumps, shall be chipped, utilized or dispersed into the sale.

4.1.6 - Road construction (1/09)

Construction of new roads or improvements of existing roads shall be done in such a way as to minimize the environmental and visual impacts. Merchantable trees shall be cut and utilized unless otherwise directed. Non-merchantable trees shall be severed and laid flat on the ground. Slash shall be chipped, utilized or dispersed into the sale. Stumps shall be set upright, not left on edge, and be moved at least 10 feet away from the road edge. Disturbed soil shall be feathered into the woods and not left in berms or windrows.

4.1.7 - Road closure (4/07)

All new roads built into the sale must be blocked to vehicle traffic upon completion of the sale. Overgrown roads that are

reopened shall be considered new roads. In general, closure may entail constructing a four-foot high berm of stumps and logs covered with dirt. Stumps and brush may also need to be placed along portions of the trail. Contact the sale administrator for specific details of design and placement.

4.1.11 - Permits (5/07)

The Purchaser will secure any necessary permits that may be required.

5 - Operations

5.1 - Notification

5.1.3 - Well heads and natural gas pipelines (7/07)

The Purchaser is responsible for contacting the gas or pipeline company prior to operating equipment in the vicinity of well heads or natural gas pipelines. Written permission is required before harvest operations begin and must be submitted to the Unit Manager.

5.1.4 - Post-sale conference (9/09)

A post-sale conference on site between the Purchaser and sale administrator is required 5 days prior to the completion of active logging operations to determine clean-up and repair of landings, road edges, and the fulfillment of other contract specifications.

5.2 - Conduct of Operations

5.2.1 - Slash

5.2.1.2 - Slash Removal

5.2.1.2.1 - Slash removal, right-of-way (12/04)

All slash must be removed at least 5 feet from the cleared right-of-way of the north Lost Lake access two-track.

5.2.1.9 - No Slash:pipe/powerline, oil/gas sites (2/04)

All pipelines, power lines, oil or gas storage sites and related access roads are to remain free of slash at all times.

5.2.1.13 - Dispose of slash as directed (12/05)

Slash is to be disposed of as directed by the sale administrator, ie: flattening taller slash piles along the lake access two-track.

5.2.3 - Operating Restrictions

5.2.3.1 - Operating restrictions (12/08)

Within Payment Unit(s) 1 & 2, unless changed by written agreement, skidding will not be permitted down the north Lost Lake access two-track. This restriction is needed to protect the road surface.

5.2.3.11 - Coppice regeneration protection (4/10)

To maximize the regen potential in this deteriorating aspen, stand 4 must be harvested during the dormant period, typically between November 1 and March 31. Timber harvest on any Payment Unit must be completed before sprouting begins in order to minimize damage to the new regeneration.

5.2.4 - Dead and Down Creation

5.2.4.2 - Dead and down creation, hare and grouse (9/10)

To improve habitat for snowshoe hare, grouse, and other species, the Purchaser is to leave two log-size pieces on the ground for every two acres. They should be scattered throughout the sale or positioned per the sale administrators instructions. If possible, the logs or trees should be felled so they overlap. Note these pieces should have a minimum length of five feet. They can be of any tree species and can be an un-merchantable piece of wood. Whole trees can only be left with the sale administrator's approval.

5.2.29 - Shrub protection (9/07)

Do not cut or damage mast-producing shrubs, which includes mountain ash. These woody-shrub plants are highly beneficial to various wildlife species.

5.2.37 - No decking areas (12/08)

No decking is allowed within 50 feet of the pipeline corridor without permission of the pipeline company.

5.2.38 - No decking against live trees (2/04)

Cut products may not be decked against unmarked or designated leave trees.

5.2.43 - Opening protection (12/08)

No activities are permitted in openings marked on the timber sale map with the letter "G". Any damage to the openings shall be repaired according to specifications of the Unit Manager or his/her representative.

5.4 - Soil Protection

5.4.1 - Rutting restriction, general (1/09)

Operations are to cease immediately if equipment and weather conditions result in rutting of roads and skid trails which is 12 inches or greater in depth and 50 feet in length. The Unit Manager or his/her representative may restrict hauling and/or skidding if ruts exceed the specified depth. With the Unit Manager or his/her representative's approval, the Purchaser may return to the area when the risk of rutting has decreased. Additional limitations per the pipeline company will apply where equipment crosses a buried pipeline.

6 - Safety and Fire Prevention

6.2 - Signing

6.2.1 - Road posting (9/09)

The purchaser is responsible for posting and maintaining caution signs on the north Lost Lake access two-track prior to beginning operations. The road must be posted at the location designated on the map with a "W" to warn of logging activity and truck traffic. Signs must be removed when harvest operations are suspended or completed. If the Purchaser provides the sign, it must meet the specifications of the Unit Manager or his/her representative.

7 - Other Conditions

7.2 - Extensions

7.2.2 - No extensions (3/09)

There will be no extensions granted on this contract for Payment Units 1 & 2 which contain the highest-risk aspen. If only Unit 3 remains to be cut, the contract may be extended, with justification, for one year.

7.5 - Loss

7.5.1 - Deteriorating timber (7/09)


The sale area has received damage from fungal diseases affecting the aspen. The aspen, particularly in stand 4, is losing volume through decay, dieback and outright mortality. 
