### 2. Bidder's Qualifications (1/11)

Purchaser shall obtain workers compensation insurance to cover claims under Michigan's Worker's Disability Compensation Act of 1969 or similar employee benefit act of any other state applicable to an employee. If all or part of a timber sale was prepared by a private contractor, that contractor and that contractor's company are not permitted to bid on the timber sale contract. Bids will not be accepted from individuals or companies appearing on the DNRE/FMD No-Bid List. This list contains the names of purchasers who previously failed to execute a contract within 21-days or who have a history of poor performance.

### 3. Preparation of Sealed Bids (1/11)

Bids shall be manually signed in ink; bid prices must be entered for each species and product in the Bid Price column for all material subject to bidding; and all fill-in blanks must be completed. If erasures or other changes appear on the forms, each erasure or change must be initialed by the person signing the bid.

### 4. Submission of Sealed Bids (1/11)

Bid forms may be obtained from the Unit Manager. All bids must be submitted on the bid form and in an envelope clearly identified as described in this section. NOTE: Only one bid form per bid envelope. Sealed bids must be submitted to the Unit office designated in the prospectus and must be submitted at or prior to the time established in the prospectus. The envelope should show on the outside (a) that it is a "Bid for Timber," and (b) the sale name or number, and (c) the date and time of bid opening as shown in the prospectus. Bids received after the time specified in the sale prospectus are late bids and will be rejected.

### 5. Public Opening of Sealed Bids (1/11)

If conditions permit, the sealed bids will be publicly opened and posted at the time and place set in the prospectus.

### 6. Award of Contract (1/11)

Award of the contract will be made to the Bidder whose bid, conforming to the prospectus, is most advantageous to the State of Michigan on the basis of total value at rates bid for the estimated quantities. The State reserves the right to reject any bid or waive any minor irregularity in bids received. A written award mailed (or otherwise furnished) to the successful Bidder shall be deemed to result in a binding contract without further action by either party.

### 7. Down Payment (1/11)

The Bidder to whom award is made must make a down payment within 21 days of the sale award. The amount of the down payment will be calculated as shown in the Bond and Payment Schedule of this prospectus. Only cash may be used to meet this requirement.

### 8. Performance Security (1/11)

As guarantee of faithful performance, a cash bond, certificate of deposit, surety bond or irrevocable letter of credit (LOC) is required within 21 days of the sale award. The amount of the performance security is shown in the Bond and Payment Schedule of this prospectus. If an LOC or surety is used, the coverage must extend for at least 6 months beyond the contract expiration.

### 9. Timber Sale Contract (1/11)

Additional conditions and requirements common to all timber sales are listed on the timber sale contract (R4031) and are available on line at www.michigan.gov/dnr. Contact the Unit Manager for additional information or a sample contract. Within 21 days of the date of the award letter, the bidder must sign the contract and provide the required down payment, performance security, and verification of worker's disability compensation. The down payment and performance security shall be in accordance with the provisions of the timber sale contract, in the sums stated in this prospectus. If these actions are not taken, then the Bidder, the Bidder's corporation, and the corporation's principals may not be permitted to bid on State timber sales for a period of 1 year. In addition, the Bidder certifies that if awarded this contract, the Bidder will complete the timber

sale contract in accordance with its terms and any modifications thereof including requirements to purchase, cut, and remove the included timber by the termination date.

### 10. Disclaimer of Estimates and Bidder's Warranty of Inspection (1/11)

Before submitting this bid, the Bidder is advised and cautioned to inspect the sale area, review the requirements of the sale contract, and take other steps as may be reasonably necessary to ascertain the location, estimated volumes, construction estimates, and operating costs of the proposed sale. Failure to do so will not relieve the Bidder from responsibility for completing the contract.

The Bidder warrants that this bid is submitted solely on the basis of the Bidder's examination and inspection of the quality and quantity of the timber offered for sale and the Bidder's opinion of the value thereof and the costs of recovery. No reliance should be placed on the State of Michigan's estimates of timber quality, quantity or costs of recovery. Bidder further acknowledges that the State of Michigan: (i) expressly disclaims any warranty of fitness of timber for any purpose; (ii) offers this timber as is without any warranty of quality (merchantability) or quantity and (iii) expressly disclaims any warranty as to the quantity or quality of timber sold.

### 11. Certification and Chain-of-Custody (1/11)

Unless otherwise indicated in the contract under section 7 – Other Conditions of the Sale Specific Conditions & Requirements, the area encompassed by this timber sale is certified to the standards of the Forest Stewardship Council (FSC) - Certificate #SCS-FM/COC-00090N and the Sustainable Forestry Initiative (SFI) - Certificate # NSF-SFIS-5Y031-S1. Forest products from this sale may be delivered to the mill as "FSC and / or SFI certified" as long as the contractor hauling the forest products is chain-of-custody (COC) certified or covered under a COC certificate from the destination mill. ### 1 - Sale Area

### 1.2 - Boundaries

### 1.2.1 - Painted boundaries (12/08)

The sale boundary and Payment Unit boundaries are marked and identified by blue, red and yellow paint. Exterior sale boundary lines against private property are marked with blue paint. Exterior sale boundary lines against state are marked with red paint. Interior Payment Unit boundaries are marked with yellow paint.

### 2 - Timber Specifications

### 2.1 - Included Timber

### 2.1.2 - Clearcut unit(s) w/o unmerchantable trees (12/08)

Within Payment Unit(s) 1-4, cut all jack pine and aspen trees which meet minimum piece specifications in 2.2 Utilization. DO NOT CUT any oak, birch, or red pine.

### 2.2 - Utilization

### 2.2.3 - Stump heights (4/07)

Stump heights within the Sale Area shall not exceed 6 inches for all trees to facilitate regeneration.

### 2.4 - Special Protection

### 2.4.3 - Reserve areas (1/09)

The Purchaser shall protect reserve areas from damage by the Purchaser's operations. Reserve areas are marked with a green boundary line. The Purchaser shall not cut live or dead trees within reserve areas. If the Purchaser's operations have cut or damaged reserve areas through carelessness, the Purchaser shall pay current market value as fixed, agreed and liquidated damages for each acre or part thereof cut or damaged. Such payment does not constitute ownership of the undesignated timber.

### 3 - Payments

### 3.3 - Pre-measured Sales

### 3.3.4 - Dividing payment units (12/08)

Payment unit(s) 1, 2, & 3 may be divided at the request of the purchaser and upon approval of the Unit Manager. Dividing payment units is a contract modification which requires a Timber Sale Contract Supplement.

### 4 - Transportation

### 4.1 - Construction

### 4.1.6 - Road construction (1/09)

Construction of new roads or improvements of existing roads shall be done in such a way as to minimize the environmental and visual impacts. Merchantable trees shall be cut and utilized unless otherwise directed. Non-merchantable trees shall be severed and laid flat on the ground. Slash shall be scattered, and not left in windrows and kept a minimum of 10 feet back from the road edge. Stumps shall be set upright, not left on edge, and be moved at least 10 feet away from the road edge. Disturbed soil shall be feathered into the woods and not left in berms or windrows.

### 4.1.7 - Road closure (4/07)

All new roads built into the sale must be blocked to vehicle traffic within 30 days of completion of hauling. Overgrown roads that are reopened shall be considered new roads. These roads must be rendered impassable to ORVs, cars and trucks and must be completely obliterated for the first 100 feet. All stumps from road building and landing construction must be reserved to block any newly constructed roads upon completion of the sale. These stumps must be scattered along the road system to

prohibit vehicular movement. Contact the sale administrator for specific details of design and placement.

### 4.2 - Maintenance

### 4.2.4 - Grading (12/08)

Roads must be graded after the sale is completed. In general, this will require a road grader or bull dozer to shape up the roads after forest products have been hauled off site. The grading equipment to be used must be approved by the Unit Manager or his/her representative.

### 4.2.5 - Two wheel drive condition (2/04)

All existing trail roads on and adjacent to the sale area must be passable by two-wheel drive traffic for the duration of the sale

### 5 - Operations

### 5.1 - Notification

### 5.1.1 - Pre-sale conference (12/08)

A pre-sale conference on site between the Purchaser and sale administrator is required prior to beginning any operations. The Unit Manager or his/her representative must be contacted at least 10 days in advance to schedule the conference.

### 5.2 - Conduct of Operations

### 5.2.1 - Slash

### 5.2.1.1 - Slash within sale area (2/04)

No trees are to be felled outside the sale area and all slash is to be kept at least 10 feet back from the blue paint line.

### 5.2.1.2 - Slash Removal

### 5.2.1.2.1 - Slash removal, right-of-way (12/04)

All slash must be removed at least 10 feet from the cleared right-of-way of forest roads and at least 50 feet from the Widewaters Road.

### 5.2.1.8 - Slash height (12/08)

No slash or tree tops may exceed 24 inches in height.

### 5.2.1.11 - Slash for reforestation (5/07)

To facilitate reforestation, the sale area shall be left with slash evenly distributed. Bunched tops within the cutting area shall be broken up and scattered. Stumps shall be cut low to the ground. Processing sites shall not be left with a compacted layer of slash; tops from these sites shall be hauled back into the cut area and scattered.

### 5.2.2 - Hazard Trees/Snags

### 5.2.2.1 - Den trees (2/04)

Obvious hollow and/or den trees shall be protected and left standing unless they are a safety hazard.

### 5.2.3 - Operating Restrictions

### 5.2.3.1 - Operating restrictions (12/08)

Within Payment Unit(s) 1-4, unless changed by written agreement, cutting, skidding, and hauling are not permitted during the period of 12/1 to 4/1. This restriction is due to stump height requirements.

### 5.2.37 - No decking areas (12/08)

No decking is allowed to impede traffic on the Widewaters Road and the East Tower/Betsy River Road. Decking must be done in a manner that will allow at least one vehicle to pass any equipment while loading and/or unloading on the mentioned roads. Contact the sale administrator for specific details of design and placement.

### 5.2.38 - No decking against live trees (2/04)

Cut products may not be decked against unmarked or designated leave trees.

### 5.4 - Soil Protection

### 5.4.1 - Rutting restriction, general (1/09)

Operations are to cease immediately if equipment and weather conditions result in rutting of roads and skid trails which is 12 inches or greater in depth and 50 feet in length. The Unit Manager or his/her representative may restrict hauling and/or skidding if ruts exceed the specified depth. With the Unit Manager or his/her representative's approval, the Purchaser may return to the area when the risk of rutting has decreased.

### 5.4.5 - Soil caution (11/04)

Care must be taken to minimize soil damage due to the sandy soils. Roads in this sale deteriorate quickly in dry conditions and may require extra maintenance. Late fall and early winter may be optimal time to harvest this sale.

### 5.8 - Protection of Endangered Species

### 5.8.5 - Protection of raptor nests (4/09)

All trees with raptor nests will be protected if found during harvesting operations. Notification will be made to the Unit Manager or his/her representative who will notify the Wildlife Biologist so an on-site evaluation and recommendation can be made, if necessary.

### 6 - Safety and Fire Prevention

### 6.2 - Signing

### 6.2.1 - Road posting (9/09)

The purchaser is responsible for posting and maintaining caution signs on Widewaters and East Tower/Betsy River Roads prior to beginning operations. The road must be posted at appropriate distances from the sale area to warn of logging activity and truck traffic. Signs must be removed when harvest operations are suspended or completed. The Purchaser will provide these signs.

### 7 - Other Conditions

### 7.3 - Contract Modifications

### 7.3.3 - Modification for reforestation (8/05)

When contractual work of Purchaser has been accepted for any Payment Unit identified on Sale Area Map, Payment Unit will be eliminated from the Sale Area on written notice so that reforestation operations can begin.

### 1.2 - Boundaries

### 1.2.1 - Painted boundaries (12/08)

The sale boundary and payment unit boundaries are marked and identified by blue and red paint. Exterior sale boundary lines against private property are marked with blue paint. ### 2 - Timber Specifications

### 2.1 - Included Timber

### 2.1.2 - Clearcut unit(s) w/o unmerchantable trees (12/08)

Within Payment Unit(s) 1 and 2, cut all jack pine trees which meet minimum piece specifications in 2.2 Utilization. DO NOT CUT ANY RED OR WHITE PINE, OAK, ASPEN, PAPER BIRCH, RED MAPLE, FIR or SPRUCE. Protect as much sapling red and white pine regeneration as possible throughout the sale.

### 2.2 - Utilization

### 2.2.3 - Stump heights (4/07)

Stump heights within the Sale Area shall not exceed 6 inches for all trees or are to be kept as low as practically possible. This is in order to facilitate regeneration operations.

### 2.2.8 - Utilization and removal (7/05)

All products meeting standards set forth in 2.2 Utilization must be removed from the sale area.

### 3 - Payments

### 3.3 - Pre-measured Sales

### 3.3.4 - Dividing payment units (12/08)

Payment unit(s) 1 and 2 may be divided at the request of the purchaser and upon approval of the Unit Manager. Dividing payment units is a contract modification which requires a Timber Sale Contract Supplement.

### 3.4 - Damaged Timber

### 3.4.1 - Damaged timber (6/05)

General Condition and Requirement 3.4 Damaged Timber, defines liquidated damages for undesignated live merchantable trees which are cut or injured. In addition, extreme care should be taken to avoid damage to tree seedlings and saplings, especially submerchantable red and white pine and oak. Damage to residual trees (defined as breaking of the cambium layer, broken tops or bending of trees from their natural position) is not acceptable.

### 4 - Transportation

### 4.1 - Construction

### 4.1.6 - Road construction (1/09)

Construction of new roads or improvements of existing roads shall be done in such a way as to minimize the environmental and visual impacts. Merchantable trees shall be cut and utilized unless otherwise directed. Non-merchantable trees shall be severed and laid flat on the ground. Slash shall be scattered, and not left in windrows and kept a minimum of 10 feet back from the road edge. Stumps shall be set upright, not left on edge, and be moved at least 10 feet away from the road edge. Disturbed soil shall be feathered into the woods and not left in berms or windrows.

### 4.1.7 - Road closure (4/07)

All new roads built into the sale must be blocked to wheeled motorized vehicle traffic and ORV traffic upon completion of the

sale. Overgrown roads that are reopened shall be considered new roads. These roads must be rendered impassable to all wheeled motorized vehicles. All stumps from road building and landing construction must be reserved to block any newly constructed roads upon completion of the sale. These stumps must be scattered along the road system to prohibit vehicular movement. Temporary berms may be required if no sale activity occurs for 30 or more consecutive days. Contact the sale administrator for specific details of design and placement.

### 4.2 - Maintenance

### 4.2.1 - Hauling restriction (12/08)

Hauling on the Coast Guard Road may be restricted by the Unit Manager or his/her representative. The restriction is because of the sandy nature of the Coast Guard Road. This road also serves as access to private property.

### 4.2.3 - Road maintenance (9/08)

The following road maintenance is required: all existing roads used to access the sale must be routinely maintained so that they are left in a passable condition for general use.

### 4.2.4 - Grading (12/08)

Roads must be graded after the sale is completed. In general, this will require a road grader or bull dozer to shape up the roads after forest products have been hauled off site. The grading equipment to be used must be approved by the Unit Manager or his/her representative.

### 5 - Operations

### 5.1 - Notification

### 5.1.1 - Pre-sale conference (12/08)

A pre-sale conference on site between the Purchaser and sale administrator is required prior to beginning any operations to determine landing and new road locations.

### 5.2 - Conduct of Operations

### 5.2.1 - Slash

### 5.2.1.1 - Slash within sale area (2/04)

No trees are to be felled outside the sale area and all slash is to be kept at least 10 feet back from the blue paint line.

### 5.2.1.2 - Slash Removal

### 5.2.1.2.1 - Slash removal, right-of-way (12/04)

All slash must be removed at least 10 feet from the cleared right-of-way of forest roads.

### 5.2.1.8 - Slash height (12/08)

No slash or tree tops may exceed 24 inches in height.

### 5.2.2 - Hazard Trees/Snags

### 5.2.2.1 - Den trees (2/04)

Obvious hollow and/or den trees shall be protected and left standing unless they are a safety hazard.

### 5.2.22 - Operating Caution

### 5.2.22.1 - Operating caution (12/04)

It is recommended, but not required, that within Payment Unit(s) 1 & 2, hauling occur during frozen winter conditions. This restriction is because of the very sandy nature of the Coast Guard Road. This road can get bad quickly with heavy truck traffic. Trucking during freezing temperatures would be optimal.

### 5.2.31 - Landing locations (10/09)

The existing roads leading to the north end of Unit 1 are not passible for logging trucks. The topography in sale area is irregular and the soil type is very sandy. Because of this road construction will be limited and landing locations may not be in optimal places. Landings will be confined to south end of Unit 1. Skidding distances will possibly be 1/4 to 1/2 mile long. These areas will be designated by the sale administrator at the pre-sale conference.

### 5.2.38 - No decking against live trees (2/04)

Cut products may not be decked against unmarked or designated leave trees.

### 5.2.40 - Pathway protection (10/10)

The North Country Pathway is a hiking trail and is shown on the Timber Sale Map. Do not damage posts with blue pathway markers. Maintain a 10 foot wide slash, debris, and rut free zone daily, using the pathway as the centerline. Do not run equipment down the pathway. Skidding across the trail should be minimized to a couple of crossings.

### 5.4 - Soil Protection

### 5.4.1 - Rutting restriction, general (1/09)


