PROSPECTUS NOTE: The MB Extension KW (72-035-11-01) sale has special requirements related to Payment Unit (PU) 4. An on-site, pre-bid meeting can be arranged to discuss these requirements. The DNR is conducting a test comparing different methods of measuring trees and determining tree volume. PU 4 is a test area and has 40 test plots, i.e. there is roughly one test plot per acre. "Cut" trees have been numbered at each plot. "Leave" trees have been marked with letters. Certain "Cut" trees on each test plot must be felled and cut into product lengths when DNR staff is present. Additional cuts above the last pulp stick may also be required. DNR staff will then make detailed measurements of each tree. There are 135 measurement trees.

The bidder is advised to inspect the sale area and review the location, estimated volumes, operating costs and contract terms of proposed sales. Please be aware that some landowners may request 60 days or more notice for access across their land.

SALE NOTE: The test trees in PU 4 (see Spec. 99.1) of the MB Extension KW sale must be cut within 90 days of contract execution. The cutting of the test trees must occur in one period of time, for example, over a period of one or two weeks. A roundwood operation is required for the harvesting of the test trees. The cutting of these trees could be done independently of your normal harvest activities. In other words, a faller could work with the DNR staff falling and bucking trees independently of your normal harvest plan. If the wood from the test trees is not removed from the site, then advanced payment is not required. If the test trees are removed from the site, then PU 4 must be paid in full or payment for the removed trees will be required within 30 days of scaling/billing. Plot locations and the list of measurement trees is available and will be provided at the pre-work meeting. 2. Bidder's Qualifications (2/12)

Purchaser shall obtain workers compensation insurance to cover claims under Michigan's Worker's Disability Compensation Act of 1969 or similar employee benefit act of any other state applicable to an employee. If all or part of a timber sale was prepared by a private contractor, that contractor and that contractor's company are not permitted to bid on the timber sale contract. Bids will not be accepted from individuals or companies appearing on the DNR/FRD No-Bid List. This list contains the names of purchasers who previously failed to execute a contract within 21-days or who have a history of poor performance.

3. Preparation of Sealed Bids (1/11)

Bids shall be manually signed in ink; bid prices must be entered for each species and product in the Bid Price column for all material subject to bidding; and all fill-in blanks must be completed. If erasures or other changes appear on the forms, each erasure or change must be initialed by the person signing the bid.

4. Submission of Sealed Bids (6/11)

Bid forms may be obtained from the Unit Manager. All bids must be submitted on the bid form and in an envelope clearly identified as described in this section. NOTE: Only one bid form per bid envelope. Sealed bids must be submitted to the Unit office designated in the prospectus and must be submitted at or prior to the time established in the prospectus. The envelope should show on the outside (a) the sale name or number and (b) the date and time of bid opening as shown in the prospectus. Bids received after the time specified in the sale prospectus are late bids and will be rejected.

5. Public Opening of Sealed Bids (1/11)

If conditions permit, the sealed bids will be publicly opened and posted at the time and place set in the prospectus.

6. Award of Contract (1/11)

Award of the contract will be made to the Bidder whose bid, conforming to the prospectus, is most advantageous to the State of Michigan on the basis of total value at rates bid for the estimated quantities. The State reserves the right to reject any bid or waive any minor irregularity in bids received. A written award mailed (or otherwise furnished) to the successful Bidder shall be deemed to result in a binding contract without further action by either party.

7. Down Payment (1/11)

The Bidder to whom award is made must make a down payment within 21 days of the sale award. The amount of the down payment will be calculated as shown in the Bond and Payment Schedule of this prospectus. Only cash may be used to meet this requirement.

8. Performance Security (1/11)

As guarantee of faithful performance, a cash bond, certificate of deposit, surety bond or irrevocable letter of credit (LOC) is required within 21 days of the sale award. The amount of the performance security is shown in the Bond and Payment Schedule of this prospectus. If an LOC or surety is used, the coverage must extend for at least 6 months beyond the contract expiration.

9. Timber Sale Contract (1/11)

Additional conditions and requirements common to all timber sales are listed on the timber sale contract (R4031) and are available on line at www.michigan.gov/dnr. Contact the Unit Manager for additional information or a sample contract. Within 21 days of the date of the award letter, the bidder must sign the contract and provide the required down payment, performance security, and verification of worker's disability compensation. The down payment and performance security shall be in accordance with the provisions of the timber sale contract, in the sums stated in this prospectus. If these actions are not taken, then the Bidder, the Bidder's corporation, and the corporation's principals may not be permitted to bid on State timber sales for a period of 1 year. In addition, the Bidder certifies that if awarded this contract, the Bidder will complete the timber sale contract in accordance with its terms and any modifications thereof including requirements to purchase, cut, and remove

the included timber by the termination date.

10. Disclaimer of Estimates and Bidder's Warranty of Inspection (1/11)

Before submitting this bid, the Bidder is advised and cautioned to inspect the sale area, review the requirements of the sale contract, and take other steps as may be reasonably necessary to ascertain the location, estimated volumes, construction estimates, and operating costs of the proposed sale. Failure to do so will not relieve the Bidder from responsibility for completing the contract.

The Bidder warrants that this bid is submitted solely on the basis of the Bidder's examination and inspection of the quality and quantity of the timber offered for sale and the Bidder's opinion of the value thereof and the costs of recovery. No reliance should be placed on the State of Michigan's estimates of timber quality, quantity or costs of recovery. Bidder further acknowledges that the State of Michigan: (i) expressly disclaims any warranty of fitness of timber for any purpose; (ii) offers this timber as is without any warranty of quality (merchantability) or quantity and (iii) expressly disclaims any warranty as to the quantity or quality of timber sold.

11. Certification and Chain-of-Custody (10/11)

Unless otherwise indicated in the contract under section 7 – Other Conditions of the Sale Specific Conditions & Requirements, the area encompassed by this timber sale is certified to the standards of the Forest Stewardship Council (FSC) - Certificate #SCS-FM/COC-00090N and the Sustainable Forestry Initiative (SFI) - Certificate # NSF-SFIS-5Y031-S1. Forest products from this sale may be delivered to the mill as "FSC Pure and / or SFI certified" as long as the contractor hauling the forest products is chain-of-custody (COC) certified or covered under a COC certificate from the destination mill. The purchaser is responsible for maintaining COC after leaving the sale area.

* The total volume is statistically estimated within plus (+) or minus (-) 11.72 percent. The estimated units are final and not subject to adjustment. Prospective bidders are urged to examine this timber and to make their own estimates of quantity and quality.

BOND AND PAYMENT SCHEDULE:

1. A bond in the amount of **\$2,000.00** to insure faithful performance of the conditions of the contract will be deposited by the successful bidder within 21 days of the sale award.
2. Cutting in any sale or unit without the required advance payment would be considered a trespass.

1 - Sale Area

1.2 - Boundaries

1.2.1 - Painted boundaries (12/08)

The sale boundary and Payment Unit boundaries are marked and identified by blue, red, green and yellow paint, in addition to an unpainted designated Payment Unit boundary shown on the timbersale map: the pipeline trail road from the red line north to the gas well defines part of the boundary between Units 5 & 6. Exterior sale boundary lines against private property are marked with blue paint. Exterior sale boundary lines against state are marked with red paint. Interior Payment Unit boundaries are marked with yellow paint. Interior retention islands are marked with green paint. These islands are not Included Timber and are to be left. Do not cut green painted trees. Do not cut blue painted boundary line trees. Cut and utilize red painted boundary line trees that meet the applicable 2.1 Included Timber definition. Yellow painted trees designating an interior Payment Unit boundary are only to be cut if they meet the applicable 2.1 Included Timber definition and all surrounding Payment Units have been paid.

2 - Timber Specifications

2.1 - Included Timber

2.1.1 - Clearcut unit(s) with unmerchantable trees (8/11)

Within Payment Unit(s) 4, 5 & 6, cut all Jack Pine, Aspen, Red Maple and Cherry trees that are two (2) inches or more in diameter measured at a point four and one-half (4-1/2) feet above ground level regardless of merchantability. In addition, cut all Oak that meet minimum piece specifications in 2.2 Utilization, and cut all Red Pine that are 12" DBH and under. Note that Payment Unit 4 encompasses some largely-failed Red Pine plantation rows near Unit 2.

2.1.2 - Clearcut unit(s) w/o unmerchantable trees (8/11)

Within Payment Unit(s) 3, cut all Oak, Jack Pine, Red Maple and Cherry trees which meet minimum piece specifications in 2.2 Utilization. In addition, cut all Aspen trees that are 2" DBH and up, and cut all Red Pine trees that are 12" DBH and under.

2.1.3 - Cut tree marked unit(s) (12/08)

Within Payment Unit(s) 1, Red Pine & Oak are designated for cutting when marked with orange paint above and below stump height, regardless of merchantability. In addition, all Aspen, Jack Pine, Red Maple and Cherry are designated for cutting.

2.1.8 - Designated plantation row unit(s) (12/08)

Within Payment Unit(s) 2, all Red Pine trees which meet minimum piece specifications in 2.2 Utilization, within designated plantation rows are designated for cutting. Designated plantation rows are every third row, identified by orange paint at the row ends. Also cut orange painted Red Pine in the adjacent undesignated rows. Jack Pine, Aspen, Oak, Red Maple and Cherry are designated cut species across all rows, except do not cut green painted Oak.

2.1.11 - Description of timber note (2/04)

Note that the Black Cherry was added to the Oak pulp and the Red Maple was added to the Aspen pulp (less than 7 cords total).

2.2 - Utilization

2.2.2 - Chipping required (1/11)

Payment Units 4, 5 & 6 must be chip harvested to facilitate future silvicultural activities. The purchaser has the option to produce sawlogs or pulpwood bolts, but the remaining portion of the trees must be chipped and hauled. The requirement to retain approximately 1/6 to 1/3 of tree tops and limbs less than four inches in diameter does not apply (G. C. & R. 2.2) because follow-up planting of poorly-stocked areas will be necessary.

2.2.3 - Stump heights (4/07)

Stump heights within the sale area shall not exceed 6 inches for all trees except the large saw (20"+) and multiple-stem saw clumps. Cut those exception trees as low as possible, not to exceed 18". This is in order to facilitate planting operations and next entry thinnings.

3 - Payments

3.3 - Pre-measured Sales

3.3.4 - Dividing payment units (12/08)

Payment unit(s) 5 & 6 may be divided at the request of the purchaser and upon approval of the Unit Manager. Dividing payment units is a contract modification which requires a Timber Sale Contract Supplement.

3.4 - Damaged Timber

3.4.1 - Damaged timber (6/05)

General Condition and Requirement 3.4 Damaged Timber, defines liquidated damages for undesignated live merchantable trees which are cut or injured. In addition, reasonable care should be taken to limit the amount of damage to tree seedlings and saplings. Damage to residual trees (defined as breaking of the cambium layer, broken tops or bending of trees from their natural position) is not acceptable.

Within the sale area, if more than 25% of the tree seedlings or saplings (1/4" to 4.5" DBH) within a specified portion of the sale area are damaged, liquidated damages will be assessed at \$300 per acre for all acreage within that specified portion of the sale area that was damaged. Operational paths will have to be cut through saplings where needed to avoid damaging residual trees. Saplings that are damaged incidental to harvesting must be cut low to the ground in order to facilitate sprout regeneration.

No damage is acceptable to merchantable trees. Within the sale area, if more than 5% of trees (> 4.5" DBH) within a specified area of the sale are damaged, liquidated damages will be assessed for all trees damaged. Rates will be in accordance with General Condition and Requirement 3.4 Damaged Timber.

4 - Transportation

4.1 - Construction

4.1.3 - Slash and earthen piles (8/04)

Piles or windrows of earth along roads and landings that have been widened or constructed shall be leveled. Slash from road maintenance or construction, including stumps, shall be chipped, utilized or dispersed into the sale area.

4.1.6 - Road construction (1/09)

Construction of new roads or improvements of existing roads shall be done in such a way as to minimize the environmental and visual impacts. Merchantable trees shall be cut and utilized unless otherwise directed. Non-merchantable trees shall be severed and laid flat on the ground. Slash shall be utilized or scattered, not left in windrows and be kept a minimum of 10 feet back from the road edge. Stumps shall be set upright, not left on edge, and be moved at least 10 feet away from the road edge. Disturbed soil shall be feathered into the woods and not left in berms or windrows.

4.1.7 - Road closure (4/07)

All new roads built into the sale must be blocked to vehicle traffic upon completion of the sale. Overgrown roads that are reopened shall be considered new roads. In general, this may require constructing a four foot high berm of stumps and slash covered with dirt. Stumps and slash may also need to be scattered along portions of the trail. Contact the sale administrator for specific details of design and placement.

4.1.11 - Permits (5/07)

The Purchaser will secure any necessary permits that may be required.

5 - Operations

5.1 - Notification

5.1.1 - Pre-sale conference (12/08)

A pre-sale conference on site between the Purchaser and sale administrator is required prior to beginning any operations to determine landing and road locations. The Unit Manager or his/her representative must be contacted at least 5 days in advance to schedule the conference.

5.1.3 - Well heads and natural gas pipelines (7/07)

The Purchaser is responsible for contacting the gas or pipeline company prior to operating equipment in the vicinity of well heads or natural gas pipelines. Contact RCS Services at 989-732-7999. The wellsite within Payment Unit 6 is State Elmer B4-17. Pipelines include a segment connecting B4-17 to adjacent corridors along Pennsylvania Crossing and Oak Lake Roads. A compression station and well is located to the southeast of Payment Unit 1.

5.1.4 - Post-sale conference (6/11)

A post-sale conference on site between the Purchaser and sale administrator is required prior to the completion of active logging operations to determine clean-up and repair of landings, road edges, and the fulfillment of other contract specifications.

5.2 - Conduct of Operations

5.2.1 - Slash

5.2.1.1 - Slash within sale area (2/04)

No trees are to be felled outside the sale area and all slash is to be kept at least 10 feet back from the blue paint line.

5.2.1.13 - Dispose of slash as directed (12/05)

Slash is to be disposed of as directed by the sale administrator, ie: flattening taller slash piles within the visual depth zone of county roads.

5.2.3 - Operating Restrictions

5.2.3.3 - Bark slippage restriction (3/09)

Within Payment Unit(s) 1 & 2, unless changed by written agreement, cutting and skidding are not permitted during the period of April 15 to July 15. This restriction is because of bark slippage.

5.2.29 - Shrub protection (9/07)

Do not cut or damage hawthorn, witch-hazel, dogwood or juneberry. If damage occurs incidental to harvesting, cut the stem at ground level in order to facilitate re-sprouting. These woody-shrub plants are highly beneficial to various wildlife species.

5.4 - Soil Protection

5.4.1 - Rutting restriction, general (1/09)

Operations are to cease immediately if equipment and weather conditions result in rutting of roads and skid trails which is 12 inches or greater in depth and 50 feet in length. The Unit Manager or his/her representative may restrict hauling and/or skidding if ruts exceed the specified depth. With the Unit Manager or his/her representative's approval, the Purchaser may return to the area when the risk of rutting has decreased.

6 - Safety and Fire Prevention

6.2 - Signing

6.2.1 - Road posting (9/09)

The purchaser is responsible for posting and maintaining caution signs on Oak Lake and Pennsylvania Crossing Roads prior to beginning operations. The road must be posted at appropriate distances from the sale area to warn of logging activity and truck traffic. Signs must be removed when harvest operations are suspended or completed. If the Purchaser provides the signs, their design must meet with the approval of the sale administrator.

7 - Other Conditions

7.5 - Loss

7.5.1 - Deteriorating timber (7/09)

The sale area has received damage from age-related decline and mortality in the overmature component of the Jack Pine. The purchaser should harvest the wood as soon as possible. The Department of Natural Resources is held free of responsibility of any further damage or deterioration due to delay in harvesting.

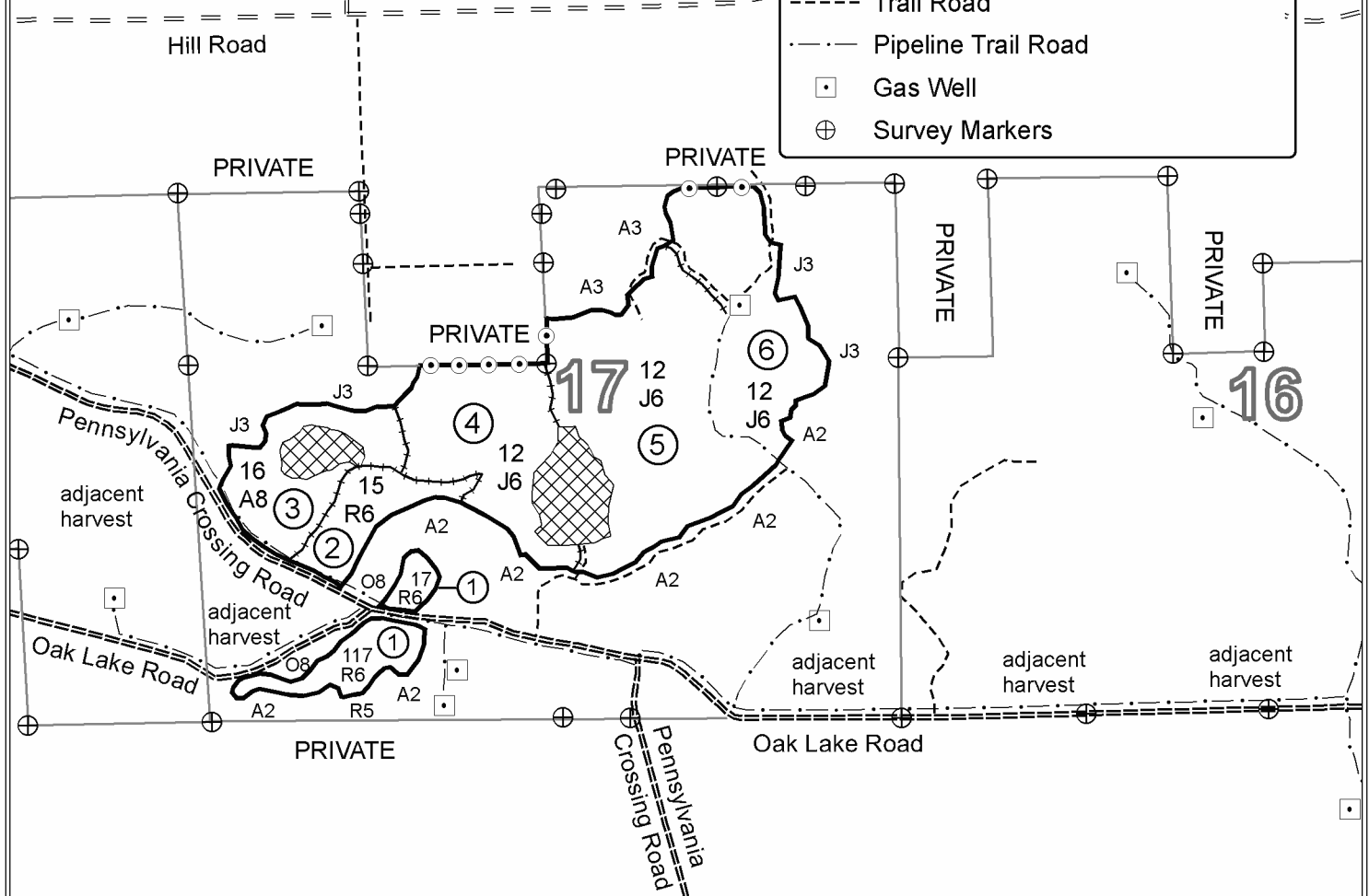

1.2 - Boundaries

1.2.1 - Painted boundaries (12/08)

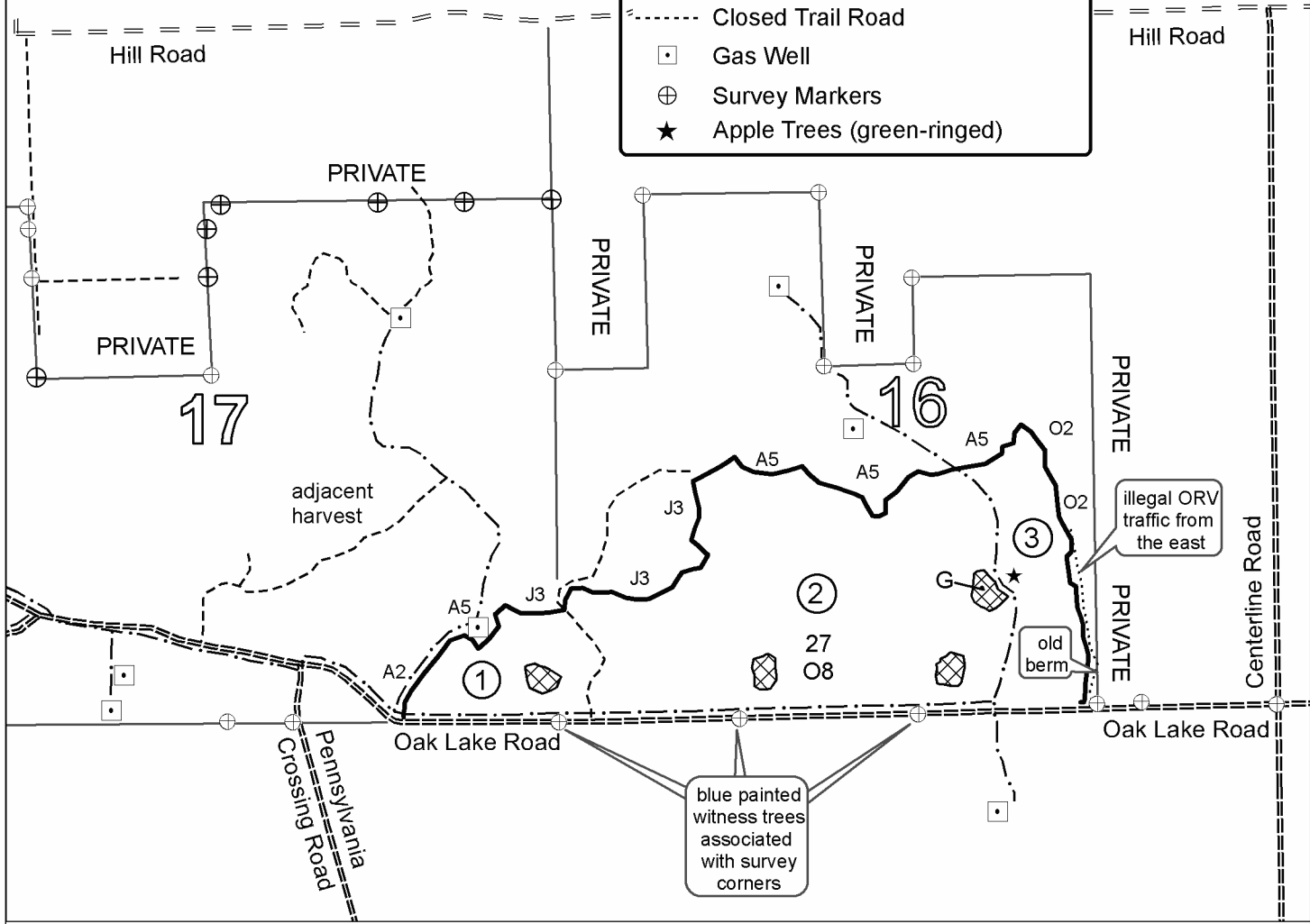

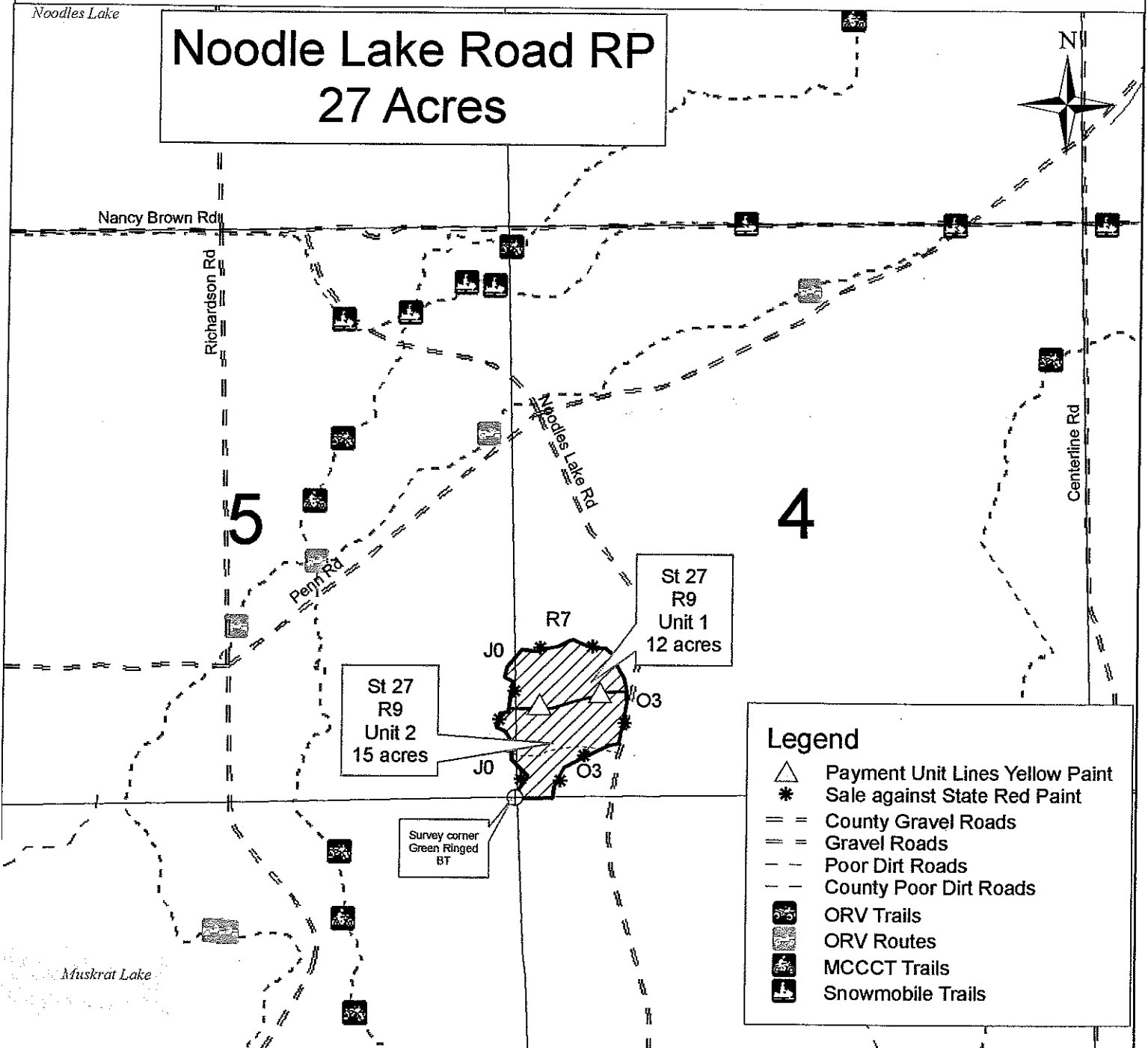

2 - Timber Specifications

2.1 - Included Timber

2.1.7 - Leave tree marked unit(s) (8/11)

Within Payment Unit(s) 1 & 2, all trees, which meet minimum piece specifications in 2.2 Utilization, are designated for cutting except for trees marked with green paint above and below stump height.

2.1.11 - Description of timber note (2/04)

Note that 1/2 MBF of red maple and three MBF of mixed oak was converted to pulpwood, in addition 6 cords of black cherry was added to the red maple pulpwood total.

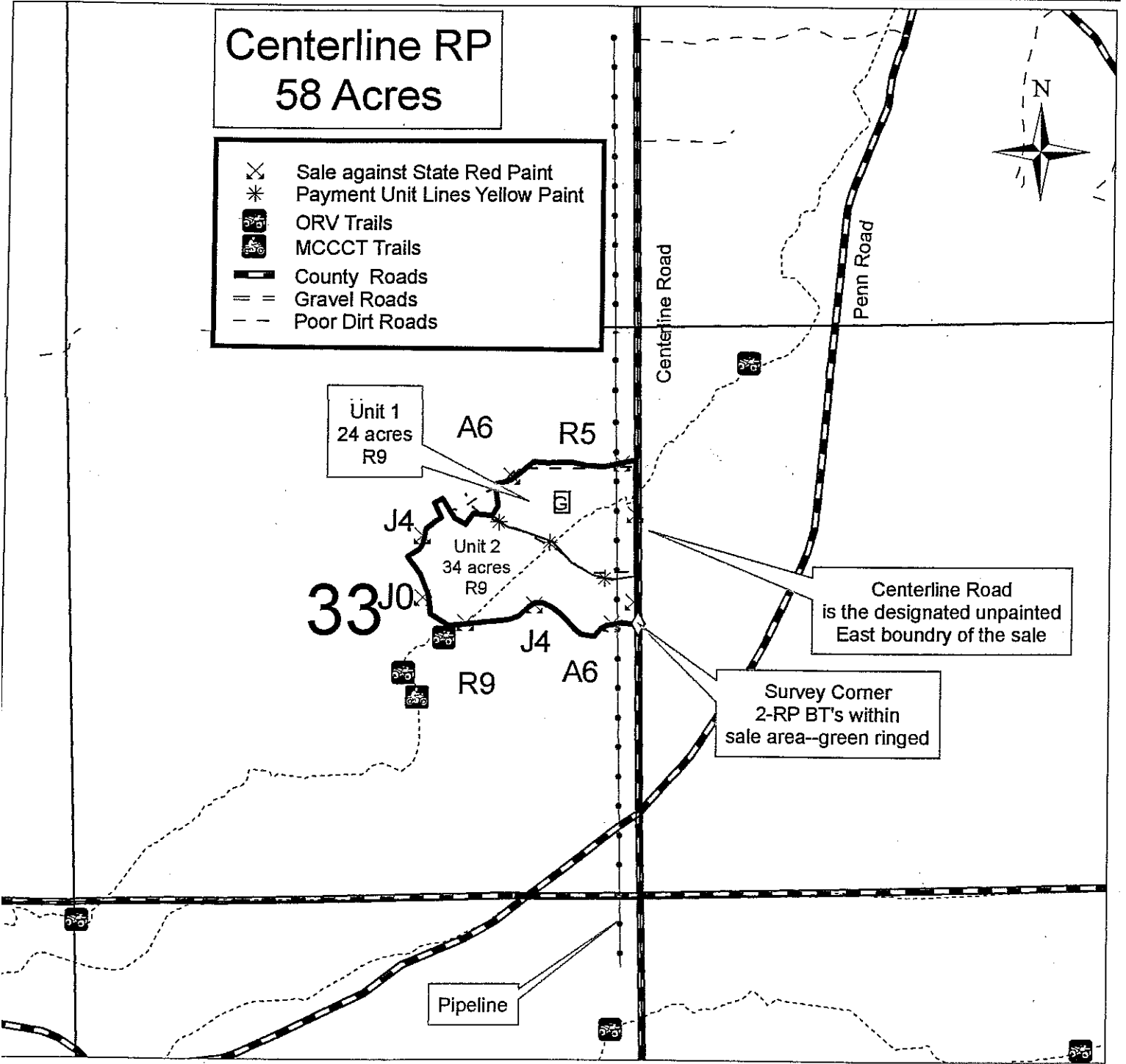

5.1.1 - Pre-sale conference (12/08)

TIMBER SALE MAP

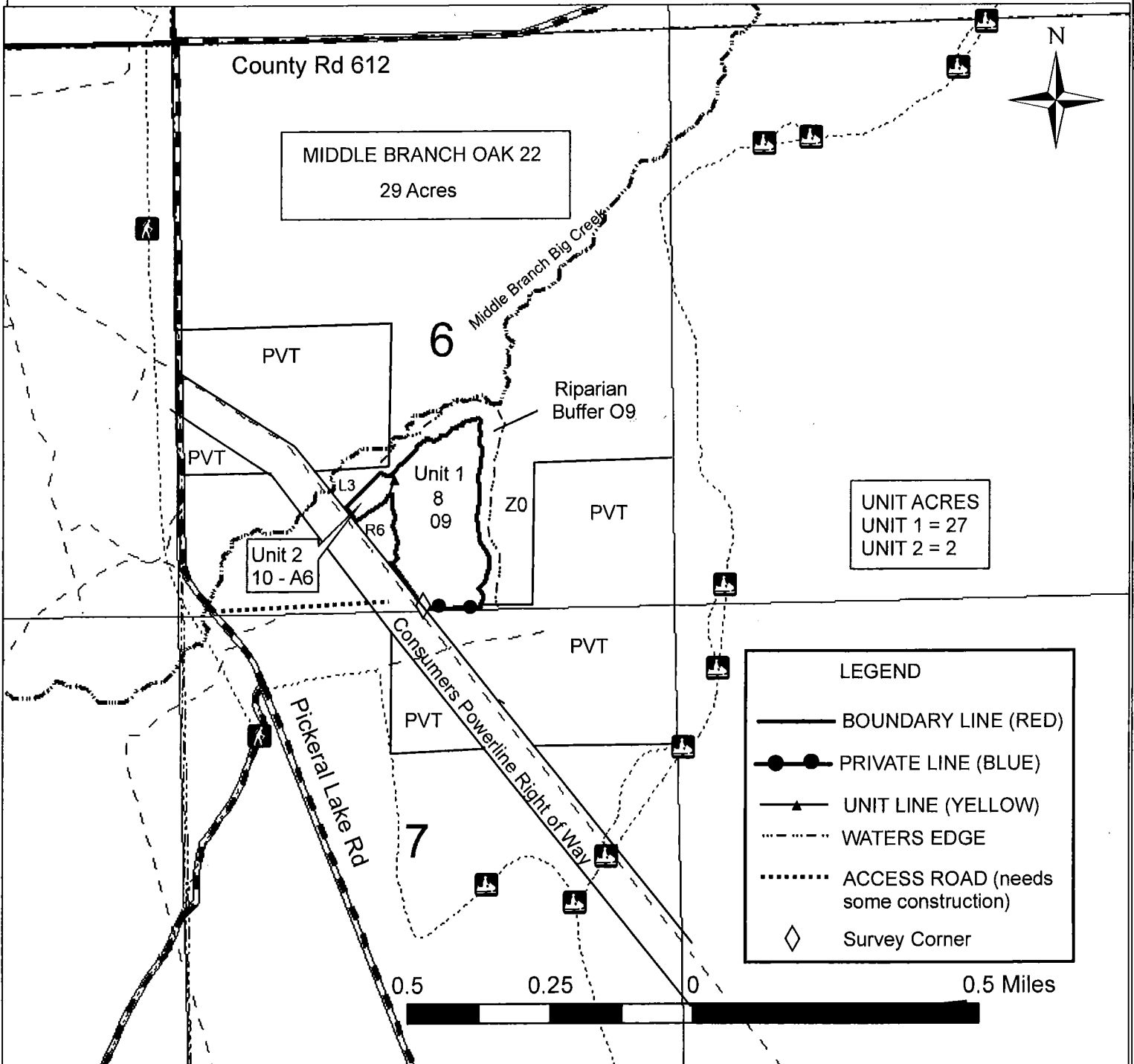
