Species Description

Brook trout to 14-18 inches and brown trout as large as 20-24 inches in length with the majority of fish resulting from natural reproduction.

Noteworthy

The Brule River is a popular water for fishing from kayak or canoe. There are some stretches that require a short drag over rocks during low flow periods. The river is shallow and can be navigated by wading. This section of river has had tree drops to provide adult trout habitat and is suitable to all styles of fishing.

Fishing Regulations

The Brule River above the US Hwy 2 Bridge is managed under the Michigan-Wisconsin Boundary Water Regulations. Please refer to these regulations in the current Michigan Fishing Guide.

Directions to Site

From the city of Iron River travel west on US Hwy 2 to M-73 on your left (south). Turn onto M-73 and proceed to the Bridge over the Brule River. This is the Wisconsin-Michigan border. Parking is along the roadside and canoes frequent this launch site. It is a 15 mile float to M-189 (45.9877, -88.652396) and there is a small parking area and canoe platform on the Wisconsin side of the river. The gradient is low in this stretch of the river and in periods of low flow dragging may be required to cross shallow areas.
