Brown Trout; Steelhead

Species Description

The St. Clair River provides excellent opportunities to catch multiple species of trout and salmon. Stocked brown trout are often caught between 12 to 20 inches while steelhead trout, Chinook salmon, and Coho salmon often reach more than 30 inches. An occasional Atlantic salmon can be caught that has moved into the St. Clair River from Lake Huron.

Noteworthy

While you are enjoying the fishing experience you can view the maritime activities that cruise through the St. Clair System in the shadow of the Bluewater Bridge. The river flow is rather fast in the St. Clair River so a heavier weight is needed to get your lure or bait down in the current. At this site it is recommended that you use a weight heavier than a 4 ounces. Many fish are caught on spoons or crankbaits, but some anglers utilize the shiners that they net from the edge of the wall. Make sure to bring a long handled landing net to get your fish up to the walk.

Fishing Regulations

The St. Clair River in Port Huron is a designated Type 4 trout stream. Please refer to the Inland Trout and Salmon Stream Regulations in the current Michigan Fishing Guide.

Directions to Site

Starting on I-94 East near Marysville continue north to Pine Grove Ave (exit 275). Turn right on Pine Grove Ave and take that road to Thomas Edison Drive and turn left. Thomas Edison Drive will end at Thomas Edison Parkway and at that point the parking lot will be straight in front of you. There are two entrances to the lot so you can turn left or right to get to an entrance.
