Species Description

Each year, the DNR stocks approximately 60,000 steelhead smolts in the Huron River between the Flatrock Dam and Lake Erie. These fish head out to Lake Erie to grow and mature and then return to the river to spawn. Steelhead caught here range from 2 to 10 pounds or larger. There is plenty of shoreline to fish from in Hurock Park and you can cross the river by walking over the bridge at the lowhead dam and fish both sides. Park rules prohibit wading here as water flows can vary greatly and depth cannot be accurately gauged.

Noteworthy

This section is very popular and can become quite busy with fisherman lining the banks. If you have a small boat, there is a boat launch located across U.S. 24, downstream of Hurock Park, that you can put in at. Most anglers fishing from shore cast spawn bags, flies, or spinners into the river. The river is quite wide here and usually there is plenty of room to spread out.

Fishing Regulations

Huron River in the area of Flatrock Dam in Hurock Park is a designated Type 4 trout stream. Please refer to the Inland Trout and Salmon Stream Regulations in the current Michigan Fishing Guide.

Directions to Site

Hurock Park is located in the City of Flatrock on Arsenal Street, west of Telegraph Road (US-24) and just downstream of the Flatrock Dam. The park lies between West Huron River Drive to the north, Will Carleton to the south and U.S. 24 to the east. Arsenal Street can be entered onto from W. Huron River Drive or Telegraph Road.
