Species Description

Wild brook trout to 12 inches and wild brown trout to 20 inches plus can be found here.

Noteworthy

This is walk-in access only to the "Williams Tract", a large tract of land on the Au Sable River that the State acquired in 1994. There are a number of trails off the main road that go to the river, including one a quarter mile north of Pollack Bridge Road that goes into a sand trap maintained by the DNR and local conservation groups. This reach has had a lot of habitat improvement done by the local Trout Unlimited Chapter, with funding from the DNR Fisheries Habitat Improvement Account. Habitat includes whole trees, log structures, spawning riffles, brush bundles and log covers.

Fishing Regulations

The Au Sable River at Williams Tract is a designated Type 1 trout stream. Please refer to the Inland Trout and Salmon Stream Regulations in the current Michigan Fishing Guide.

Directions to Site

From M-72 west of Grayling, go north on Au Sable Trail. Continue on Au Sable Trail until it ends in a T with Pollak Bridge Road. Turn left (west) and the access is the first drive on the right (north). There is a gate there, park along the side of the road as this is walk-in access only.
