



Postscript from Dr. L. M. M. 22, 1853
Believe me a continual trial & expense to myself & my wife, George Davis of the United States, having been to the
U.S. I have determined twice out and hurried the above described Country, and do hereby certify
that it is true that we have been to both natural & artificial as we understand a half acre, and divided
in the fields into many though not extensive with the rest into the same general areas.

S. 100 ft 10 1/2 acres








#78. Mr. John Day Beary's Rice land and cultivated, about 100 bushels, with an orchard. Rice A. H. 37


#79. Bluebeard's Rice land and cultivated, about 100 bushels. Rice A. H. 37
