- A. Description of original monument and accessories and/or subsequent restoration:

(K3) Corner common to Sections 1-2-11-12. Corner remonumented in 1951 by Dean C. DeLeNater, RLS with a 1° 10 iron pipe and 4° brass cap placed from two original bearing tress. New bearing trees marked - 18" Hemlock \$33E 59 links, 12" hemlock \$18W 50 links, 14" Hemlock N36E 74 links. Northern Paper Hills records dated 1953 show that the 1951 monument was recovered as described and two additional MBTs were marked - 12' Hemlock SSIE 13 links, & Remlock S42W 4 1/2 links. The MPM record states original BT Y. Birch 24' 844E 22, I.M. very plain. Tree is green in feir condition. Old marks and Reg's. The 1951 monument was also recorded by the Michigan Dept. of State Highways and Transportation in 1958

[6-Sec. 1] Mortheast 1/16 corner, Sec. 1. Corner not established in the original survey. Found no subsequent record. [5-Sec. 1] North 1/16 corner, Sec. 1. Corner not established in the original survey. Found no subsequent record.

B. Description of corner evidence found and/or method applied in restoring or reestablishing corner:

(K3) Found and accepted the 1951 monument - a 1° 1.D. iron pips capped with a 4° brass Michigan Dept. of Conservation tablet - at record bearing and distance from the 3 1951 MBTs. the 18" healoch is now a dead atub \$305 38.1", the other two healocks are in good condition with blazes overgroun: 14' dia. \$200 32.2', re-marked "\$11 NBT", 18" dia. M39E 48.1' re-marked "\$1 NBT". The NPM Hemlock SE was found to be a 22' Hemlock \$50E 7.9' to face. The 8' RPM Hamlock was found a 12' die. tree with eld overgrown blazes \$47W 27.0' (41 links). The original Y. Birch BT was found a dead stub \$35E 22 links. No scribing is visible but old rotted blaze and axe marks were plain. Marked one new bearing tree as described below.

(6-Sec. 1) Found no evidence of prior monumentation at the corner position. Established the corner at the intersection of straight lines connecting apposite 1/16 corners, all monumented. At the position for the corner I placed a 1°I.D.x32° iron pipe capped with a 4° dis. cast aluminum MDMR teblet, appropriately stamped. Corner falls in an open cedar mersh about 30' South of the M'ly margin and about 50' East of the M'ly margin. A 3' dead cedar snag with a location poster facing the corner is \$80W, 18.4' distant. (5-Sec. 1) Found no evidence of prior monumentation at the corner position. Established the corner on a straight line between Center of Section 1318.38' South and quarter corner 1303.19' North, being 20 chains, proportionate to the original record, north of the center. At the position for the corner I placed a 1°10x32° iron pipe capped with a 4° dis. cast alumin MONR tablet, appropriately
