

A. Description of original monument and accessories and/or subsequent restoration:

G-1; Closing Corner between Sections 3 and 4, T50N, R31W;

Originally established during U.S. Survey conducted by Guy Carleton, D.S. in 1852 and monumented with a wood post witnessed by a

Sugar 10 S20°W 13 lks.
(Recovered as ground-level remains.)

and a

Sugar 8 S55°E 29 lks. (Gone)

The late Norman Thompson, RLS #4348 states in his field notes dated 24 July 1945 (copies of which were obtained from the Northern Hardwoods' office in L'Anse) that he recovered the southwest U.S. bearing tree. Mr. Thompson set a hardwood post and noted the following new bearing trees:

Sugar 13 S59°E 19.0'
(Recorded as a moderately decayed 18" dia. stump 30" tall having ax marks on lower face blaze evident.)

and a

Sugar 6 S85°W 25.9' (Gone)
