Set a 1"(I.D.) \times 36" galvanized iron pipe with a 2" aluminum cap appropriately stamped as to location 12" below the road surface.

(i), (iii), (iv), and (v) are marked with upper and lower blazes. The lower blaze is scribed "NBT". Both blazes and a band around the tree at the upper blaze are painted red.

During the course of a survey conducted by Stephen Douglas of the Bureau of Land Management from 10 May 1984 to 10 November 1984 and approved 23 September 1985, this corner was remonumented with a 9/16" x 30" copperweld from a bearing accessory established in 1935 by Marshall J. Hall, Junior Engineer, U.S. Indian Service. The BLM field notes state that

"The 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 20 and 21, determined at record bearing and dist.; from the remains of a 1935 bearing accessory:

The base of a cedar post, 6 ins. diam., firmly set, flush with the ground, for a reference monument, bears East, 25 lks. dist., with no mks. visible.

This cor. was set at the cor. position called for by Marshall J. Hall, Junior Engineer, U.S. Indian Service, in 1935, according to his field notes of "Carp River Truck Trail" recovered at the Federal Records Center, Chicago, Illinois. There is no remaining evidence of the orig. cor.; however, this position is harmoniously related to existing orig. cors., and is accepted as the best available evidence of the orig. cor position.

The BLM noted the following new bearing trees:

Oak 7 N67°E 56 lks. (36.96')
Found a red oak presently alive and 11" in diameter having a healed lower blaze.
I added an upper blaze and painted both blazes red as well as painted a red band around the tree at the upper blaze.
