B. Description of corner evidence found and/or method applied in restoring or reestablishing corner:

Found a 3/4" x 27" iron rod 6 inches below the surface of an old dirt road. On the north side of this iron rod a 3/4" x 18" iron rod and cap marked "LS 32432" (Jerry Taylor) was found. Replaced the found iron

rod a 3/4" x 18" iron rod and cap marked "LS 32432" (Jerry Taylor) was found. Replaced the found iron rod with a 1"(I.D.) x 36" galvanized iron pipe and cap. Corner is located 32 feet north of the physical centerline of Taylor Road. Accepted as the best available evidence of the position of the original corner.

C. Description of monument for corner and accessories established to perpetuate locating the position of the corner:

Set a 1" (I.D.) x 36" galvanized iron pipe with a 2" aluminum cap stamped as to location 6 inches below ground.

On 30 May 1979, Robert Crampton, PS #24591 recovered and accepted a "3/4" iron bar found 16' North of "T" Road on an Old 2 rut road". According to a Land Corner Recordation Certificate prepared by Mr. Crampton and recorded on 30 August 1979 in Liber 1 on page 346 of the Baraga County Land Corner Records, this monument is of unknown origin. Mr. Crampton left the monument in place and noted the following new bearing trees:

Found a white birch presently alive and 10" in diameter.

Set a 7" spike directly below an overgrown nail and tag on the W/side. No blazes

or markings were added to this tree. Measured N30°E 34.22'

During the course of a survey conducted by Stephen Douglas of the Bureau of Land Management from 10 May 1984 to 10 November 1984 and approved 23 September 1985, a 3/4" diameter iron rod as recorded by Mr. Crampton in 1979 was found and accepted. The BLM indicates a tie to one of Mr. Crampton's new bearing trees as follows:
