

FOUND 3/4" IRON PIPE, BUT COULD FIND NO RECORD SUPPORTING IT. MEASUREMENTS ALONG TOWNSHIP LINE ONE MILE WEST AND TWO MILES EAST, TYING IN FOUND STANDARD AND CLOSING CORNERS AND OCCUPATION LINES, INDICATE THE OCCUPATION FENCE NORTH, APPROXIMATELY 25 FEET EAST OF FOUND PIPE CORRESPONDS WITH SECTION LINE BETWEEN SECTION 34 AND 35, T4N R9W. A VAGUE OCCUPATION LINE SOUTH (MARGIN BETWEEN TWO CULTIVATED FIELDS) WOULD BE CONSISTANT WITH EITHER THE FOUND PIPE OR A POSITION DETERMINED BY THE GOVERNMENT JOG, APPROXIMATELY 20 FEET EAST OF THE FOUND PIPE. MEASUREMENTS TO OCCUPATION LINES AND RESTORED CORNERS 1/4 MILE WEST (MARGIN BETWEEN FIELDS), 1/2 MILE WEST (OLD OCCUPATION FENCE), AND ONE MILE WEST (RESTORED CORNER), CONFLICT, ONE WITH ANOTHER. THE FENCE 1/2 MILE WEST IS WITHIN 1/2 FOOT OF MIDWAY BETWEEN THE RESTORED CORNER AT G-1 AND THE POSITION DETERMINED BY THE GOVERNMENT JOG. THE OCCUPATION LINE 1/4 MILE WEST, VAGUE AT BEST, WOULD TEND TO CONFIRM THE POSITION OF THE

FOUND PIPE, BEING WITHIN 2 FEET OF MIDWAY BETWEEN THE FOUND PIPE AND THE OLD OCCUPATION FENCE. TIED INTO PLAT MONUMENTS AND I-2. RESULTS SUPPORT THE LOCATION OF STANDARD CORNER IN LINE WITH FENCE NORTH. RESTORED CORNER BY INTERSECTING PLAT LINE AND TOWN LINE, DISREGARDED FOUND PIPE.
