*July 18, 1974 Michiana Surveyors, Southeast corner Sec. 1-8-14, found stone Southwest corner 6-8-13, found stone.

Description of corner evidence found and/or method applied in restoring or reestablishing corner:

Found stone with smaller stone around it, at this corner. Stone dates back to 1884 in a survey by Charles G. Banks. Accepted stone as best evidence of the corner.

Description of monument for corner and accessories established to perpetuate locating the position of the corner: C.

Set 3" concrete monument 36" long with aluminum cap in place of stone and is accepted as a careful and faithful perpetuation of the position of the original corner.
