

The extant Clinton County Surveyors Records, dating from 1867 to about 1925, consist of three books in which the surveys or survey information were originally recorded, one book in which the County Surveyor listed Public Land Survey corners recovered, seven notebooks containing field notes of surveys recorded and unrecorded, drain survey field notes, and some extraneous material, and two books containing copies of the United States Public Land Survey Field Notes for the County. The original books, which are on file in the Drain Commissioner's Office, have been recorded on microfilm which is on file in the Register of Deeds Office.

The contents of this collection of records produced by the County Surveyor which pertain to land surveys are listed in this cross reference by township and section, volume and page, and microfilm jacket and image designation. Drain surveys and extraneous material is not included. The Public Land Survey Field Notes are indexed on a separate sheet by township and corner code, listing microfilm jacket and image designation.

The books included in this Cross Reference are:

- 1) VOLUME 1 (hand lettered on cover), which contains surveys by the County Surveyor beginning November 5, 1867, and is designated as Volume 1 in this Cross Reference. There is no title printed on the cover nor is there a title page. In the microfilm, the index to this book appears in Jacket No. 1.
- 2) COUNTY SURVEYOR'S RECORD AND FIELD BOOK, which contains surveys by the County Surveyor beginning October 29, 1889, and is designated as Volume 2 in this Cross Reference. In the microfilm, the index to this book appears in Jacket No. 15.
- 3) RECORD OF SURVEYS NO. 1, contains witnesses to Public Land Survey Corners reputedly recovered by the County Road Commission, and is designated as Volume 3 in this Cross Reference. Only two entries are dated, being in the 1920s. In the microfilm, the index to this book appears in Jacket No. 19.
