- 4) OLD CORNER BOOK, contains a list of Public Land Survey corners recovered by the County Surveyor at various times. The original book is among those in the collection comprising the County Surveyors Records as is a hand copied reproduction. The copy was microfilmed in the interest of clarity.
- 5) HOLLISTER'S FIELD BOOKS, so-called for the purposes of this Cross Reference, consist of four notebooks and part of another in the handwriting of former County Surveyor Charles E. Hollister, covering the period from 1879 to 1900, and two and part of another in the handwriting of someone other than Hollister covering a period from 1900 to 1914.

These notebooks were discovered in the Shaiwassee County Drain Office, and returned by Surveyor John Quine of that office to Clinton County in the early 1970s. Quine prepared an index on a corner code basis for these notebooks which appears in microfilm Jacket No. 25.

References to these notebooks are given in parenthesis. Where field notes were found for a recorded survey, they are given on the same line in the Cross Reference.

6) FUBLIC LAND SURVEY FIELD NOTES, Volume 1, covering the East half of the County and Volume 2, the West half. They are a certified true copy of the original field notes of the federal government survey, as prepared by the State Land Office dated December 12, 1873.

"All such records of surveys, field notes, and calculations made by any former county surveyor, which have been or shall have been on file in the office of either the county surveyor, register of deeds or county clerk for a period of fifteen (15) years or upward, even though such records or the certification thereof shall not conform to the requirements specified in section one hundred (100) of this act, shall be admissible in evidence of the facts they contain in any court of record in this state."

Michigan Revised Statutes of 1846, Chapter 14, Section 2
