B. Description of corner evidence found and/or method applied in restoring or reestablishing corner:

1997 - Found "T" iron 1.8'± south of Coolidge Road and 5.5'± east of Henderson Road, above small pieces of brick and small pieces of wood (outside of wood appears to have been burned) and 3 accessories from 1966 (nail in T/P to north at 25.88', nail in 8" oak to WSW at 95.95' and nail in 8" cherry to SW at 111.10') and 1 accessory from 1974 (L/P to north at 24.95') and 1 accessory from 1991 (pk/cap in L/P to north at 24.98') and 3 accessories from 1994 (nail/tag #32332 in 18" ash to WSW at 95.90', nail/tag #32332 in U/P to SSE at 57.61' and nail tag #32332 in U/P to north at 24.71'. 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B. (Cont'd)

During the 1920's-1930's the GCRC reported finding a 1/2 " Pipe monumenting the position of K-5. Three accessories were noted referencing the pipe. In 1964 Rowe reported a T Iron monumenting K-5. At that time two of the three GCRC witnesses were still present and indicate that the T Iron recovered in 1964 is in the same position as the 1/2 " Pipe recovered by the GCRC. Since 1964 the T Iron monumenting K-5 has remained and many further accessories have been recorded. I recovered the T Iron and many of the recorded accessories and from this gathered data conclude that the T Iron recovered in 1997 is the same T Iron recovered in 1964 which is in the same position as the 1/2 " Pipe found during the 1920's-1930's by the GCRC. Beneath the T Iron I recovered small pieces of brick and small pieces of charred wood and conclude that this is evidence of a monument set by a county surveyor approximately 100 years ago. During research I recovered three County Surveyors records of this corner. Two records (1848 & 1849 Julian Bishop CS) claimed to have had the GLO Post as the monument, and the third (1869 SR Billings CS) also claimed to have recovered evidence of the GLO corner and said that he further perpetuated the position with a Stone 18" x 24". No mention of setting brick was present in the recovered records, but brick was typical monumentation set by County Surveyors practicing in this area during the mid to late 1800's. I also conclude that the charred pieces of wood we recovered were most likely the remnants of a stake set by a County Surveyor. The wood was possibly burned to harden the stake and subsequently that charred portion is what survived. Upon review of this evidence I accept the position of the T Iron above small pieces of brick & charred wood as a careful and faithful perpetuation of the position of the original corner.
