B. Description of corner evidence found and/or method applied in restoring or reestablishing corner:  1996 - Fnd 3/4" rod in mon. Box, and no accessories.  In 1871, S.R. Billings C.S. reported having a stake & brick monumenting the corner I-5. He also indicated in his notes that he had the US (G.L.O.) Corner, it is unclear as to what evidence he had to determine this (possibly bearing trees). S.R. Billings measured between the corners I-6 and I-5, and J-5 & I-5. Mr. Billings measurements were 20 links and 3 links, respectively, from what the G.L.O. claimed to have measured. Also worth mentioring is that S.R. Billings claimed to have found the original G.L.O. (US) corners at I-6 and J-5 as well. In 1912, the GCRC had found a stone at I-5. The route description on the plans for what is now Genesee Road South of Stanley Road says that the first course from the stone at I-5 is South, 2640" to I-6 which would still only be 20 links different than what S.R. Billings measured 40 years earlier. In a 1920 survey by the GCRC the object found monumenting I-5 was a stone & brick. Four (4) witnesses were noted one of which being a Sycamore tree to the NE which was used until 1972. In 1939 the GCRC measured between the corners I-6 and I-5, and I-4 and I-5. The distance they measured between I-6 and I-5 was 1-45" (2 links) different than the 1912 GCRC, 18 links different than the 1871 County Surveyor, and 2 links different than the G.L.O. measurement. The distance they measured between I-4 and I-5 was 5 links different than what the G.L.O. measured. We measured this same ½ mile as part of our field procedure for this project as 2635.62" (39.93 ch.) which is only 2 links different than the 1939 GCRC and 7 links from what the G.L.O. had measured. IN 1945, George H. McKonnie, PE #662, recorded the plat of "Capt's Acres". Recorded on this plat was the ½ mile measurement between the corners I-6 and I-5. This measurement was 0.65" (1 link) different than the 1939 GCRC, 0.80" (1 link) different than the 1912 GCRC, 19 links different

1955, Recorded plat - L.27, P.75 - by Richard C. West, RLS 6100, no description of monument, and no accessories.

1970, GCRC - Bridge Plans, by Ayres, Lewis, Norris & May, no description of monument, and no accessories.

1972, GCRC - Plans & field notes, find 3/4" iron pin in monument box, measured between corners I-5 & I-7, I-5 & I-6, and I-5 & I-4, and 3 accessories.

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1 link different than the 1939 GCRC measurement, and 2 links different than the GLO. They measured 2640.51' (40.0 ch.) between I-6 & I-5, which was 0.29' different than the 1945 measurement by George H. McKonnel, 0.06' different than the 1939 GCRC, 0.51' different than the 1912 GCRC; 19 links different than the 1871 County surveyor and 1 link different than the GLO. The measurement that the 1972 GCRC observed between the corners I-4 and I-5 appears to be erroneous. We measured 2635.62' (39.93 ch.) between the corners I-4 and I-5. This measurement differs from the 1972 GCRC by 49.77', but only differs by 0.09' from the 1939 GCRC, and by only 7 links from the GLO.

In 1972 a partition survey was recorded by John M. Budzick P. S. #1893, and in 1977 and CRC was recorded by David T. Rowe P. S. In 1972 a certified survey was recorded by John M. Budzick RLS #18982, and in 1977 an LCRC was recorded by David T. Rowe RLS #11192. On both of these documents were the 1920 GCRC witnesses, in which the object monumenting the corner was a stone. These witnesses appear o have been copied from the GCRC witness book. Upon review of the above stated evidence, I conclude that the 3/4" rod in a monument box we recovered is the same 3/4" iron pin in a monument box that was found in 1972 by the GCRC, and by similar measurements between I-5 and the surrounding corners appears to have remained in the same position since it was originally set by the GLO. I accept the position of the 3/4" rod in a monument box as a careful and faithful perpetuation of the position of the original corner.
