I, John R. Garske, in a field survey on December 7, 19 94, do hereby certify that under requirements of P.A. 74, Michigan P.A. of 1970, the corner points mentioned in lines 1 and 2 above were in conformance with regulations and rules therefore as required in the current manual of survey instructions of the United States Department of the Interior, Bureau of Land Management or by a decree of a Court of Law and/or that the corner points mentioned in lines 3, 4 and 5 above were in conformance with the rules of the Michigan Board of Land Surveyors or by a Decree of a Court of Law; established, re-established, monumented, re-monumented, recovered, found as expressed below:

NOTE: Not more than 4 corners, all in the same town and range, may be recorded on this certificate.

A. Description of original monument and accessories and/or subsequent restoration:

Original survey by William Ives, Deputy Surveyor, in 1848. Original corner was a wooden post and original bearing trees are: Hemlock 12" - N30°E, 22 links (14.52'); Hemlock 26" - N58°W, 14 links (9.242').

1916 - D.S.S. & A. Railroad map shows section crossing.

B. Description of corner evidence found and/or method applied in restoring or reestablishing corner:

No original evidence could be found. Corner position was re-established by using information from D.S.S. & A. (now C & NW) railroad maps dated 1916. Section line crosses the centerline of the railroad 145.4 feet easterly from the center of bridge over the Montreal River. I then extended the section line from the section corner to the north through this point to the edge of the river and set the corner in a logical location to protect and preserve its position. No other information could be found to assist in locating the corner.

C. Description of monument for corner and accessories established to perpetuate locating the position of the corner:

Set a 1-4 foot section of 3/4" diameter aluminum marsh rod with a 3 1/4" aluminum cap stamped: County Remonumentation; T47N, R47W, S-6; S-5; M.C.; 1994; RLS 28410. Corner location is at the bottom of a 6' bank. I established the following bearing trees and reference objects: 8" R. maple - N85°E, 16.92 feet; 12" R. maple - S29°W, 15.42 feet; 6" R. maple - N80°W, 16.04 feet; clump of 3-4" R. maple - N28°W, 12.20 feet; 6' steel rail with sign - N45°E, 1.88 feet.
