According to a Land Corner Recordation Certificate prepared by Robert Crampton, P.S. #24591 and recorded 20 December 1984 in Volume 2 on page 119 of the Houghton County Land Corner Records a "1 (in.) Square pin in centerline of an old road bed and on a projection of an old fence west of the corner" was recovered and accepted on 20 November 1984. Mr. Crampton did not remonument the corner.
