Post set in original government survey by J. Wampler, Deputy Surveyor, in November of 1825 and 2 bearing trees recorded: W. O. 30, S89 1/2W, 70 1/2(46.53') and W.O 18, N1/2°W, 55(36.30'). In 1888, H.F. Bean reported he found "Both witnesses standing. I found remains of stake," presumably setting a Fireclay. Bean recorded 2 witnesses; a W. Oak 14,N22 1/2W, 114(75.24') and W. Oak 10,S15 1/2E, 46 1/2(30.69'). Records of the Jackson County Road Commission (JCRC) (date unknown) describes corner as: "Fireclay Post" and show 7 witnesses: 24" W. Oak, N42°W, 67.1'; 12" Double W. Oak, S14°40'E 30.3'; steel cor. post, N45°30'E, 30.3'; new Wit. as: 18" locust, N39°W, 52.25'; 18" locust N58°W, 33.12'; 6" Walnut S62°W, 28.00'; 9" Walnut, S30°W, 39.85', cap in trees. Consumers Power Company records indicate the same as the JCRC. Michigan Department of Natural Resources (MDNR) field notes dated 4-22-38, on page 55 indicate a "Fireclay post" was found and 5 witnesses were made: N49°E fe. cor. steel post in conc. 49.0'; N12°E, 10" Cherry, 130.7'; N65°W, 12" Maple 101.4'; N15°30'E, 4" Elm, 101.0' S15°E, Stump of twin 12" S.O. 30.4'. In 1980, the corner was recorded by Ron Keller L.S. #20707 as "Set capped iron" per Land Corner Recordation Certificate (LCRC) in Liber 3, Page 252. In 1981, Tim Van Gieson L.S. #24621 notes the corner as a "1/2" re-rod" per Certificate of Survey (C.O.S.) at Liber 1188 Pages 525 & 526. In 1994, Alan Scheppelman recorded the corner as a "1/2" rerod" per Certificate of Survey (C.O.S.) at Liber 4, Page 270.

Description of corner evidence found and/or method applied in restoring or reestablishing corner: Description of original monument and accessories and/or subsequent restoration: 13 Description of corner evidence found and/or method applied in restoring or reestablishing corner:

Found a 1/2" x 23" uncapped rebar 0.2' below centerline intersection paved road North, East, and West. Excavated and found top piece of fireclay, 3" x 13" long, in place. Top of Fireclay is 2.7' below surface and is not below 1/2" rebar. Found 1/2" Rebar is 0.9' West and 1.0' North of fireclay. This iron was removed during excavation and later replaced in same location by a 1/2" x 18" rebar with cap "DEE 29245" set flush. This 1/2" rebar was established using improper procedures and is not utilized in this survey. I have perpetuated this position only to aid future surveys that may have been ofiginally tied to this previously recorded iron. Three of the 1938 DNR witnesses verify Fireclay position as good. Also found remains of wood stake on South side of Fireclay and several small stones around. Corner is in roadway fill area. Accept Fireclay as a careful and faithful perpetuation of the position of the original corner. Set a standard Jackson County Survey Monument (JCSM) directly over the Fireclay position. Buried Fireclay and rebar on North side of monument. Monument box set by the JCRC. Monument box set by the JCRC. Description of monument for corner and accessories established to perpetuate locating the position of the corner: Set 4" dia. x 36" concrete monument with 1/2" x 36" robar and Jackson County Standard Aluminum Cap stamped L.S. 29245, 1994, M-9/A-9 in monument box 49.42 PREVENTATION N52°E Centerline old steel corner fence post in concrete (MDNR 1938) N72°E 51.85' Centerline stop sign post Set nail & tag "29245" in NW side of RR tie gate post 52.55′ S50°W Set spike & tag "29245" in NE side N63°W of 26" Maple over tag #10998 (MDNR 1938)
