Schaaf - 1939 - chained by corner on Houghton's Random. No mention of corner being found. - K.J. Ostling - 1955 - 2" steel fence post which was presumably placed at a point where a square scribed post once set - but now on ground. - R.T. Ostling & G. Henning - 1961 - 3" squared Cedar post & 2" steel post. Blaze on base of 14" B. Oak S73°W 13.7' Blaze on base of 8" B. Oak N59°W 30.9' B. Description of corner evidence found and/or method applies in restoring or re-establishing corner: M12 - Standard ½ corner common to Sec. 36, T27N, R5W & Sec. 31, T21N, R4W-Fd. 2" iron fence post pipe - 4' high - w/ an 4" x 2' long cedar post scribed '1/4' that is wired to the pipe. Rows of pipes run N, S & E from the 2" fence post. Dug around the 2" iron fence post and found a 4" x 1' long red vit. tile file filled w/ concrete - down 1' just S. of 2" fence post pipe. This is apparently the bottom half of E.S. Houghton's tile monument probably set about 1939. Top half appears to have been sheared off which probably disturbed the cedar post that K. J. Ostling found lying on the ground in 1955. Accept the tile monument as the best available evidence of the position of the original corner.
