

B. Description of corner evidence found and/or method applied in restoring or reestablishing corner:

(E-7) Section Corner Common to Sections 16, 17, 20 and 21, T. 45 N., R. 11 W. This corner is being perpetuated as part of the Luce County Remonumentation Program.

Found no evidence of original corner. Found 2" pipe for comer with 2 witness pipes Northwest and Southeast at 45 This is typical of monumentation established by J. Kinsey, County Surveyor, in the 1930's. Accepted pipe for section corner.

C. Description of monument for corner and accessories established to perpetuate locating the position of the corner:

(E-7) Section Corner Common to Sections 16, 17, 20 and 21, T. 45 N., R. 11 W.

Corner is a 2" o.d. pipe projecting 18" above ground in wooded area. Set squared cedar post 2' North of corner.
