- 1849: Corner established by Guy H. Carleton 1981: Thomas A. Beaudrie, L.S. 11359. Richbryer Lakewood Subdivision recorded in P.67 of Plats. Plat notes corner but does not state what is at corner.
- 1983: Eino Sainio, L.S. 7873. Survey recorded in L.1-P.55 of Surveys notes corner. Survey does not state what is at corner.
- B. Description of corner evidence found and/or method applied in restoring or reestablishing corner:

Corner reestablished as part of the Luce County Remonumentation Program. Since the time of plat and survey, County Road H-44 has been repaved. Found a railroad spike in area of corner position. Reconstructed a corner position based on found corners from the recorded plat and survey. This position bears S 10°E - 3.18' from found railroad spike. Talked to Mr. Sainio and he stated that he had recently set railroad spike using witness corner pipes in the Southeast and Northwest quads believed to be set by County Surveyor J. Kinsey. Talked to Mr. Beaudrie and he stated that he remembers using a "Nail in the intersection". In revisiting the corner, found 2" O.D. witness corner pipes in the Southeast and Northwest quads. Distance between pipes is 90.10'. Determined railroad spike did not fit a split of the pipes by 0.30'. Did not hold railroad spike. Reestablished corner position midway and on line between found witness corner pipes. Removed railroad spike. Set a 1/2" iron in each pipe. (Continued on back).

C. Description of monument for corner and accessories established to perpetuate locating the position of the corner: Corner is a 1/2" x 24" iron with a 3 1/4" diameter stamped aluminum cap, 1" below paved road surface. Falls 5' North of centerline of County Road H-44(98) (East-West, paved). Falls on centerline of County Road 413 (North-South, paved)

In my opinion, the reestablished corner position is the true corner position based on the found witness corner pipes. This is not the same location as was used in the recorded plat and survey. The reconstructed position from the recorded plat and survey bears S08°E - 3.45′ from the reestablished corner position.
