d Corner, Section 27, T2N-R6E, Brighton Livingston County, Michigan.

Found ½" capped iron 1 foot ± deep. 7 feet ± South of centerline of Buno Road and 7' West of tree row and old fence remnants. Also found 3/4" capped iron pipe bent and adjacent to $\frac{1}{2}$ " iron. Some overhanging branches could hinder G.P.S. station.

The two witnesses on Clay Gordon's survey places the corner 5.7 feet North of existing $\frac{1}{2}$ " and would fit occupation of centerline

Clay Gordon field notes, page 13, records dug & found old stake and put in iron.

On July 10, 1973, Boss Engineering set ½" iron per instructions for establishing an obliterated ½ corner (single proportionate method) and recorded an Act 74 on 2-15-1974, see pages 16-17. In May of 1974, Donald Ross completed a total breakdown of Section 22, T2N-R6E, Brighton Township. The three witnesses utilized coincide with those of Boss Engineering. Two of three witnesses found on 1-12-1995 still checked witness set on 7-10-1973 found on 1-12-1995 still checked witness set on 7-10-1973.

On page 27, 1979 Plat of "Starshine Subdivision" exception of unplattd parcel agrees with Gordon survey of 1936. On page 31, Glenn Heil Survey tied North 1/4 Corner of Section 27 to the Northwest corner of "Pleasant Valley Estates" and it confirmed Boss Engineering location of 1973.

Found post and remnants of fence line 210 feet± East (see notes pages 12 & 13) of found ½" iron. Fd. fence recorded and measured 658.0 ft. West fits Gordon survey (page 15). This distance (658') fits West line "Starshine Subdivision" and East line "Pleasant View Estates" (page 27 for both plats).

Conclusion:

We recommend placement of corner 5.76, feet due North of location. We find this location to be the Clay Gordon Survey on

This location is 61' Southeast of old township hall and school (see notes page 13), 658 ft. East of old fence remnants (see Gordon survey page 15). This point is 210'± West and 30' South of old fence post. A ½" iron rod is 212.1' East & 29 ' North of this proposed location. A ½" iron was also found 495'± West and 33.00 ft. South of the proposed new location (see Boss notes and page 18A).
