## G-11 T3N - R5E: Northwest Corner, Section 34, Oceola Township

We found a 1/2" iron rod in the centerline of Hughes Road. There is an old fenceline running to the west. This corner was reported as being set by Sibley in 1823 for the GLO. There is an Act 74 filed by Boss from 1972 and the witnesses still check well. The Boss measure of 1972 to the east and south are each short by 2-3 feet compared to current measure. We matched the Garlock measure to the South within 2 tenths. Bullock shows a measure from the late 1800's which agrees well with the distance from this corner to the North 1/4 Corner of Section 34. We were unable to determine the origin of the iron that currently marks the corner but could not justify any other position based on the available evidence, therefor I recommend acceptance of the current position as marked by the iron to be replaced with a standard Remonumentation corner. A sweep of the area near this location did not reveal any other corner markers. This corner is heavily masked for GPS in all directions and would make a difficult location for direct occupation with GPS equipment.
