A. Description of original monument and accessories and/or subsequent restoration:

I-13 Southeast Corner of Section 34 Oceola Township was set by the
GLO in 1816 by Alex Holmes, D.S.
The original witnesses are:
Tamarack 8" N60°E 28 lks (18.5')
Tamarack 8" S23°E 35 lks (23.1')

B. Description of corner evidence found and/or method applied in restoring or reestablishing corner:

I-13 Found 1/2" iron at the intersection of the centerlines of Argentine
and Golf Club Roads.

I-13 Southeast Corner, Section 34, T3N, R5E
Set 30" x 1 1/4" iron pipe with 6" x 1 1/4" break-off and brass cap marked
as "Livingston County Monumentation Corner" at intersection of road
centerlines.

- N15°W Set nail and remon tag in E side 36" Maple 81.63'
- S75°W Set nail and remon tag in N side 30" Maple 72.32'
- S10°W Set nail and remon tag in NW side 14" Ash 30.58'
- S10°E Set nail and remon tag in SW side 8" Ash 32.17'

I-13 T3N - R5E: Southeast Corner, Section 34, Oceola Township

We found a 1/2" iron at the intersection of centerlines of Golf Club and Argentine Roads. This corner was reported as being set by Holmes in 1816 for the GLO. There are two Act 74s filed by Boss(1972). The closing corner for Genoa falls 107.90 feet west of I-13. GLO distance is 1.63 chains(107.6 feet) so it would appear that one of these corners was set at the falling distance on line. All measures since 1975 compare well with current distances. A sweep of the area near this location did not reveal any other corner markers. Considering the perpetuation of this corner since 1972 and the widespread acceptance of this corner by local surveyors I recommend acceptance of the current location with the replacement of the existing iron with a standard Livingston County Remonumentation monument. This corner is heavily masked for GPS occupation by trees and is probably not occupiable with GPS equipment.
