

I-10 T3N - R6E: WEST 1/4 CORNER, SECTION 26, HARTLAND TOWNSHIP

We found a Munsell and Garlock capped iron next to an old wooden fence post. The corner was originally recorded as being set by S. Sibley in 1823. I-10 is shown on old County surveyor notes with one witness (now gone) from 1885 Bullock records. The corner was used as a POB for the Handy-Maxfield Shores Subdivision in 1921, and on the 1951 Maxfield Park Sub Annex by Clay Gordon. Lyle Munsell shows I-10 on a survey originally done in 1966 and updated numerous times up to 1980. C. Garlock notes of 1989 show that he set the present iron in a rusted 1 1/2" iron pipe. There are Act 74s on record from C. Garlock in 1989 and 1990. I could find no conflicting evidence regarding the use of this corner and it would appear to have been used in its present location since the 1920s. The corner falls 2.7 feet north and 1.4 feet east of the equal split between the Garlock Northwest Corner (as ratified by the peer group) and the Southwest Corner as earlier ratified. There is an iron which appears to be intended to mark the block corner at the Easterly corner of Lot 78 of Handy-Maxfield Shores. This corner is within 3 feet of plat distance (1428 feet plat vs. 1431 feet measured 1994), and within 0.26 feet of the Section line. There is a tree row running south with some interruptions from the golf course, and a tree line and fence remnants to the east. The corner is fairly open other than directly to the south and would be occupiable by GPS. A sweep of the area did not reveal any additional irons. I recommend accepting I-10, the West 1/4 Corner of Section 26, at the location as is presently monumented.
