

## M-10 - EAST 1/4 CORNER SECTION 25, T3N, R6E, HARTLAND TOWNSHIP SUMMARY:

The first recorded use of this corner we could find was recorded in an Act 74 by Douglas Hooth of the Michigan Department of State Highways and Transportation. Those witnesses call for a jog of 14.98 to the West 1/4 Corner of Section 30. There is a 1" iron pipe 14.98 south of the Livingston County iron, another iron approximately 8 feet east of the Oakland County iron and records indicate an Oakland County Road Commission "T" iron 9.05 feet southeasterly of the Livingston County which was not field located. Boss Engineering has apparently used the corner as witnessed by Hooth in surveys of 1991 and 1992 as attached, and their iron is 33 feet west of the "Hooth" corner. Distances compared well with 1993 measure. There is a large tree row to the west, there is a tree row to the east offset to the south approximately 10-20 feet. The corner falls on the westerly side of the gravel road running north-south. In looking at the evidence of corner usage, occupation, and long standing acceptance I recommend approving the location of the East 1/4 Corner at the point as used by Boss and witnessed by Hooth.
