## COHOCTAH G-13

On April 12th, 1823, this standard corner was set by Deputy Surveyor John Mullett. There were no County Surveyors records found pertaining to this point.

In the modern era, comparatively little information is available on this corner. In 1981, Patrick L. Benton performed three surveys in Sections 33 and 34 that depict this corner. The material marking the corner, however, is not identified.

More recently in 1988 Darrell D. Hughes performed a survey in Section 33 that provides identification and witnesses for this corner and a tie to the closing corner G-1 for the adjacent township on the south. This closing corner is also depicted on a 1990 survey in Section 3 of Howell Township by Gary Boss.

On September 28th, 1994, fieldcrews recovered this standard corner as a 1/2" iron rod lying 5' north of the centerline of an east/west running gravel road. All four witnesses provided by Hughes in 1988 were recovered and the distance east to the closing corner was consistent with that reported by Hughes. The material marking the closing corner, a 1/2" iron rod, was the same as indicated on Boss's survey of 1990. However, none of the witness trees were located. The fieldcrew concluded that either the trees had been removed or that, more likely, there was an error in preparing the survey documents; witnesses from another corner were perhaps shown as witnesses for closing corner G-1.

The distance observed from this corner to standard corner I-13 was within 0.17 of the same length as reported on Pat Benton's work.
