## COHOCTAH M-12

April 11th, 1823, a wood post denoting this quarter corner was set by Deputy Surveyor John Mullett.

On October 19, 1993, the fieldcrew recovered a 1" Iron Bar denoting the closing corner for the township adjoining on the east. This corner lies roughly 2' East of the centerline of the North and South running gravel road. This corner was recorded by Oscar Boss in 1972 (LSC 389) and two of the witnesses from that document were recovered by the crew. The distance from corner M-13 to this closing corner is in substantial agreement with the same length depicted on surveys by Gordon'38 and Miller '73 and'84.

Standard corner M-12, however, was not recovered. A survey by Boss in 1978 gives a computed location for this corner as being 4.62 Feet North of the closing corner A-12. This is exactly half of the recorded offset between standard and closing corner at the NE corner of Section 36. At a point roughly 5' North of the closing corner, there is an old wire fence running West.

A survey by Desine in '93 failed to locate any of the standard and closing corners along this range line except for corners M-13 and M-10. Our measurement for this mile and a half is within 0.12 Feet of Desine's measurement of this same distance.

Consequently, we propose to set corner M-12 halfway between M-13 and M-11 but on line between M-11 and closing corner A-12 for T4N-R5E. This will result in the corner falling 6.67 Feet North of corner A-12, roughly 2' longer than the offset implied on the GLO plat.
