#### SOUTH 1/4 CORNER, SECTION 32, DEERFIELD TOWNSHIP F-13 T4N - R5E:

#### MONUMENTATION

F-13 was set by John Mullett for the GLO in 1823. There are multiple markers at this location. They are: 1) 1/2" re-rod that appears to be set at occupation and reported as found by Oscar Boss in 1972 and; 2) "T" iron northwesterly 6.71 feet set by Consumers Power in 1969 at 1/2 distance on line.

## **MEASUREMENTS**

Current measure for the 1/2" iron is 2637.22 feet to the east and 2645.89 feet to the west, the measurements from the "T" iron are 2641.52 feet to the east and 2641.58 feet to the west. Measures by various surveyors to east and west compare well. The closing corner falls 236.28 feet east of the 1/2" iron and 240.54 feet east of the "T" iron at F-13 (GLO computes to 240.6 feet). There are also double corners set at the closing corner.

#### OCCUPATION

The corners are in Allen Road (gravel). The 1/2" iron fits centerline well, the "T" iron is 4-5 feet north of centerline. there is a fence and tree row to the north which appears to fit the 1/2" iron best, although it is not precisely defined. A sweep of the area around the 2 markers with a magnetic locator did not reveal any other corner positions. This corner is masked for GPS and probably can not be directly occupied.

### RECORDATION

There are Act 74s filed for each of these corners. The 1/2" iron is shown as found by Oscar Boss in 1972 and the "T" iron is recorded as found by Albright in 1978 although it is shown on a 1969 Consumers Power sketch as set. The corners have been shown on 12 Act 132s. Boss has consistently used the 1/2" iron, Garlock and Albright used the "T" iron, and Chris Newman has used each. Surveys to the south of the township line have been based on the southerly location (for F-13 and the closing corner).

#### SUMMARY

From previous examples of survey work by Dorsey for Consumer's Power it is possible that the 1/2" iron may have been in at the time the "T" iron was set. The 1/2" iron fits occupation well, and is least disruptive of land ownership in this area. The parcels to the north will potentially be larger than previously reported dimensions and the reported dimensioning for the parcels to the south will be unaffected. I recommend that the existing 1/2" iron be replaced with a Livingston County Remonumentation pipe and cap.
