

I, William Lenca , in a field survey on Dec. 06 , 19 96 do hereby state that under requirements of P.A. 74, Michigan P.A. of 1970, the corner points mentioned in lines 1 and 2 above were in requirements of F.A. 14, printingal F.A. of 1970, the contemporary manual of survey instructions of the conformance with regulations and rules therefore as required in the current manual of survey instructions of the Comportance wan regulations and rules the enterior as required an area of the interior, Bureau of Land Management or by a decree of a Court of Law and for United States Department of the Interior, Bureau of Land Management or by a decree of a Court of Law and for that the corner points mentioned in lines 3, 4 and 5 above were in conformance with the rules of the Michigan Board of Land Surveyors or by a Decree of a Court of Law; established, re-established, monumented, recovered, found as expressed below:

- A. Description of original monument and accessories and/or subsequent restoration:
 - Original Survey by John Mullett B.T.'s Cedar, 24" S06°E 16 lks.; Cedar, 8" N10°E 08 lks. All original 1848: evidence for this corner has been destroyed by farming activities.
 - CERTIFIED SURVEY NO. 223 by George B. Wilson, RLS No. 17607, shows this corner as it relates to other corners in Section 8, T33N-R27W. The survey states that this corner was "Established by John Jenkins, Surveyor" at an old fence 1981: corner. (Jenkins surveyed in this area in the early 1920's.) The corner monument is described in the legend as a 1/2" x 18" iron pin.
- Description of corner evidence found and/or method applied in restoring or reestablishing corner.

We recovered a 1/2 inch diameter x 18 inch long iron rod with plastic identification cap marked RLS 17607 at an ancient fence corner - fences run West and North. The existing iron fits with dimensions shown in Certified Survey No. 223. The monumented and occupied position falls 133 feet South of a halfway split for the mile, however this corner has been used for many years by local surveyors, and is accepted as the best available evidence of the position of the original corner.

C. Description of monument for corner and accessories established to perpetuate locating the position of the corner: Set 2" dia. Aluminum Pipe/3-1/4" dia. Alum. cap stamped for corner location:
