A. Description of original monument and accessories and/or subsequent restoration:

ORIGINAL B.T.'s:

Cedar, 6", S17°E, 13 1ks B. Ash, 6", S38°W, 29 1ks

Original Survey by James H. Mullett in 1848. This corner was re-established by single proportionate measurement by Frank J. Bray (DNR Surveyor) in 1970.

B. Description of corner evidence found and/or method applied in restoring or reestablishing corner:

In 1970, Frank J. Bray set this corner on line and single proportionate measurment between the Section Corner 1 mile East and the 1/4 Corner 1/2 Mile West. He established 2 Witness Trees - 10" Cedar, N15°E, 9.1' and 14" Cedar, S43°E, 19.5 feet. He also states that he set a 1" iron pipe with 4" aluminum cap. Evidently, the monument had been removed, but we found both witness trees, the 14" Cedar was in place, but the 10" Cedar had fallen over. We were able to place the fallen witness tree upright and replaced the corner from Bray's witnesses. This position is accepted as a careful and faithful re-establishment of the position of the original corner.

C. Description of monument for corner and accessories established to perpetuate locating the position of the corner:
