- Description of original monument and accessories and/or subsequent restoration:
 - Original Survey by George E. Adair B.T.'s Beech, 6"- N30.5°E 26 lks; Beech, 10" S69°W 15 lks All original evidence for this corner has been destroyed by farming activities.
 - A survey of Section 17, T38N-R25W by Albert Haas, County Surveyor, is on record in County Surveyor's Record book in 1900: the Menominee County Register of Deeds Office. This survey states that a Cedar Post was set in the location of C-7 from Government B.T.'s. No new B.T.'s are given.
- B. Description of corner evidence found and/or method applied in restoring or reestablishing corner:

In a 1994 Survey of Section 19, T38N-R25W, we found a 3/4" dia. Iron Rod at an angel point in an old East - West Fence Line. Peter Klieman, long time resident of this area, stated that an old rock and wire fence ran North from this location, but was bulldozed out several years ago. He also stated that the location of the iron rod has been accepted for more than 50 years as the corner location. out several years ago. We The distance shown in the 1900 survey mentioned in part "A", from this corner to the 1/4 Corner to the East fits very well. We OF MICHIGA accepted the 3/4" dia. Iron Rod as the best available evidence of the position of the original corner.

C. Description of monument for corner and accessories established to perpetuate locating the position of the corner.

Set 2-1/2" dia. alum. Pipe 30" long/3-1/4" dia. Alum. cap stamped for corner location:

17.02 feet West 5/8" x 24" Iron Rod/2" dia. Alum. cap - WITNESS MARKER 5/8" x 24" Iron Rod/2" dia. Alum. cap - WITNESS MARKER S680E 24.38 feet 0.8 feet South Survey Sign Post

NOTE: The corner falls in the middle of a large farm field - no other bearing trees or objects near.

NOTE: All bearings are magnetic bearings. All distances are measured with steel tape. Distances to trees are to nail in side of tree.
