

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- A. Description of original monument and accessories and/or subsequent restoration:
  - Original Survey by E.C. Martin B.T.'s Tamarack, 10" N10°E 14 lks.; Tamarack, 10" S67°W 29 lks. Most original evidence for this corner has been destroyed by logging activities.
  - L.C.R.C. No. 210 by Billy D. Buckler states, "Found this corner while with C. Limpert, District Forester. Two Tamarack B.T.'s. One excellent and one fair condition." Set 1" Pipe with 4" Brass cap - TIES: Cedar, 4" - N21°E -1955: 22 lks.; 4" Cedar - S70°E - 37 lks.
- B. Description of corner evidence found and/or method applied in restoring or reestablishing corner:

We found a 1-1/4" Iron Pipe with a 4" brass cap set by the Michigan Department of Conservation in a location as indicated in Land Corner Recordation Certificate Number 210 by Billy D. Buckler. We also recovered the remains of one of the original Bearing Trees (Tamarack, 10" - N10°E - 9.2') down but still in good condition. This position is accepted as a careful and faithful perpetuation of the position of the original corner. OV BICKIES
