

DOSSIER FOR: THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 16, SPRINGFIELD TOWNSHIP, T 4 N, R 8 E, OAKLAND COUNTY, MICHIGAN. Prepared under contract with the County of Oakland Under Act 345 of the Public Acts of 1990.

HISTORY:

The boundary of this Township was surveyed by Alex Holmes, D.S. in 1815 and Joseph Wampler, D.S. set the Corners for the subdivision of it in 1823.

SPECIAL NOTES:

This Corner has been accepted and used since before 1973, as evidenced by the Corner being recorded under Act 74 of the Public Acts of 1970, by Forrest R. Jones, R.L.S. as recorded in Liber 6194, Page 351.

COLLATERAL EVIDENCE:

This Corner lies 9 feet East of the Centerline of Dilley Road and 33 feet East of a fence line running North and South and 142 feet South of the Centerline of the railroad tracks. There is a U.S.G.S. monument N. 01° 47' 20" E. 202.01 feet from the Corner.

We searched at least 50 feet in each direction for other stakes and found none that might represent the Corner.

The measured dimensions to the Southwest Corner of Section 16 agree with the recorded distances within 0.2 feet.

SURVEYOR'S RECOMMENDATIONS:

The selected location is accepted by the Contractor and is generally accepted by Professional Surveyors as the best available evidence of the position of the original Corner. Therefore, I recommend that the Peer Review Group accept this Corner as monumented, with the references as shown on the enclosed form prepared according to Act 74 of the Public Acts of 1970, while considering the other iron we found near the Corner.
