A. Description of original monument and accessories and/or subsequent restoration:	
<ul> <li>J-1 - Not Set in Original GLO Survey</li> <li>From 1891 to 1904 approximately, Osceola County had a remonumentation program, in which surveyors Temple and Trumbull, did the work. For the most part, a 3" glazed tile filled with cinders from a forge, were placed at each government set corner in the township. There were supposed to be 3 tile per corner, placed atop of each other, thereby making the corner 4 feet long. Sometimes a solid tile, with a cross in the top was used, and sometimes a iron bar or pipe was added to the tile. Notes of the work were kept in ledgers, and given to the townships, and 5 of the townships have been entered in the County Surveyor's records.</li> <li>LCRC - L. 2 P. 10 - K.J. B. Description of corner evidence found and/or method applied in restoring or reestablishing corner:  J-1 - Closing 1/4 Corner Common to Sec. 2, T17N, R9W - K. J. Ostling found one tile monument in this area. He accepted the Tile as J13 - T18N, R9W and Set J-1 accordingly. Upon review by Osceola Co. Remon. Peer Group it was decided that the tile monument represented J1-T17N, R9W because Hersey Twp. to the South is Tiled but Cedar Twp. to the North is not. Thus we remove closing 1/4 corner DNR Monument and Reset leaning N'ly over center of 1 1/2" O.D. Iron Pipe in Tile. Monument accepted as the best available evidence of the position of the corner.
