A. Description of original monument and accessories and/or subsequent restoration:				
 K-1 - The original corner was set by deputy surveyor John Hodgson on June 10, 1836. Set wood post 79.08 chains from the South and 37 Lks East of post. Beech 7" S39W 29 Lks. Beech 7" S21E Lks. From 1891 to 1904 approximately, Osceola County had a remonumentation program, in which surveyors Temple and Trumbuil, did the work. For the most part, a 3" glazed tile filled with cinders from a forge, were placed at each government set corner in the township. There were supposed to be 3 tile per corner, placed atop of each other, thereby making the corner 4 feet long. Sometimes a solid tile, with a cross in the top was used, and sometimes a iron bar or pipe was added to the tile. Notes of the work were kept in ledgers, and given to the townships, and 5 of the townships have been entered in the County Surveyor's records. LCRC L.2, P. 121 K. J. B. Description of corner evidence found and/or method applied in restoring or reestablishing corner:				
K-1 - Closing Corner common to Sec. 1 & 2, T17N, R9W - K. J. Ostling had found one tile monument where 2 monuments should have been present along the Township line. Ostling used the tile monument as Standard Corner for K13-T18N, R8W. Upon review by Osceola Co. Remon. Peer Group it was decided that the Tile monument at this location represented the closing corner for K1, T17N, R9W because; 1. Hersey Twp. to the S. is tiled but Cedar Twp. to the North is not tiled. 2. A probably GLO Pine Stp. BT fits the position for the Standard Corner location 24.42' West of the Tile Mon. Thus I removed Standard Corner DNR Monument next to 3/4" Iron Rod in Tile and Reset closing corner DNR Mon. 24'42' West of KJO Position leaning N'ly over center of 3/4" Iron Rod Tile Mon. Monument accepted as the best available evidence of the position of the original corner.
