Hodgson-1837 Hemlock 8" S42°W 35L., Hemlock 7" N36°W 23L From 1891 to 1904 approximately, Osceola County had a remonumentation program, in which surveyors Temple and Trumbull did the work. For the most part, a 3" glazed tile filled with cinders from a forge, were placed at each government set corner in the township. There were supposed to be 3 tile per corner, placed atop of each other, thereby making the corner 4 feet long. Sometimes a solid tile with a cross in the top was used, and sometimes a iron bar or pipe was added to the tile. Notes of the work were kept in ledgers, and given to the townships, and 5 of the townships have been entered the County Surveyor's recordsOsceola Co.
