

I, <u>Craig W. - A. Description of original monument and accessories and/or subsequent restoration:
- I-3 -GLO- Set Post-J. Hodgson-1838
 Bl. Oak 20" N67°W 10L., Bl. Oak 15" S25°E 15L.
 -Osceola Co. Cedar FB., P. 30-31-1904+, Sub. of Sec. 11
 Pine 14" N89°W 41L., Pine 16" N 57.5° 36L.
 -LCRC L. 2, P. 257- H. J. Mulder- 1986 Set 1/2" capped iron rod at fence cor. post of ancient fences N,S & E. South 2.71' N&C in W side 11" Oak, S75°E 17.52' N&C in N side Trip. 8" Oak, N8°E 28.46' N&C in E side 12" Oak, S35°W 42.55' N&C in SE side twin 14" Oak
- B. Description of corner evidence found and/or method applied in restoring or reestablishing corner:
- I-3 Sec.cor. common to Sec. 2,3,10 & 11- Found LS Cap # 25862 on 1/2" x18" rebar in 6" dia. rotten cedar anchor post bottom per LCRC in agreement with 2 Co. BT Pine Stp's. This position is believed to have been perpetuated by Co. Surveyor F. Trumbull in the early 1900's and is accepted as the best available evidence of the position of the original corner.
- C. Description of monument for corner and accessories established to perpetuate locating the position of the corner:
- I-3 Replace Capped 1/2" rebar with 4" DNR A.C. on 1"x36" iron pipe in post bottom with ring of stone. Carsonite post 1' N
 Reset Capped 1/2" rebar-Down 1.5'- on N side as memorial.
 N 58°W 25.23' to set spike in CL 16" Pine Stp. remains (Old NBT)
 N 88°W 28.35' to set spike in CL 14" Pine Stp. remains (Old NBT)
 S76°E 17.45' to set N&T in N side 8" Twin R. Oak scribed 'XBT' (HJM)
 N14°E 28.82' to set N&T in E side 15" R. Oak scribed 'XBT' (HJM)
 S46°W 42.60' to set N&T in SE side 16"Tw.R. Oak scribed 'XBT' (HJM)
 S13°E 2.71' to set N&T in W side 12" R. Oak scribed 'XBT' (HJM)
