A. Description of original monument and accessories and/or subsequent restoration: The original corner was set by deputy surveyor John Hodgson on 1 November 1837. 18" Pine for corner 40.00 chains from East.	
From 1891 to 1904 approximately, Osceola County had a remonumentation program, in which surveyors Temple and Trumbull, did the work. For the most part, a 3" glazed tile filled with cinders from a forge, were placed at each government set corner in the township. There were supposed to be 3 tile per corner, placed atop of each other, (continued on back)	
B. Description of corner evidence found and/or method applied in restoring or reestablishing corner:	
Found DNR Monument above, labeled South 1/4 Cor Sec. 34 T18N-R9W, as per Ostling L.C.R.C. I believe the distance to the N. 1/4 Sec. 3 T17N-R9W should be Due east 19.6 feet, as shown State Project No. 75-44. I found the tile, state monument in remains pine tree as per Government survey. The peer group concluded this to be the standard corner, and assumed the tile to be placed in error.
